

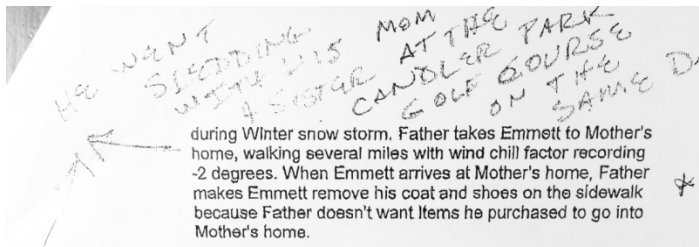
The Unprotected In The Winter Storms Lie:

In the last week of January and again in the first week of February here in Decatur and across Atlanta, the roads were closed twice for three consecutive days each due to what became known as “Snowmageddon”. Emmett and I loved it! We had a sled and had never been able to use it since moving into our home in 2011. We went EVERYWHERE sledding, laughing snowball fights, making snow angels until we wore ourselves out! Because the roads were closed and only the MARTA trains were running, we sledded to the Avondale Station, 5 min from our front door, then sledded from the East Lake Station the last half-mile to his mom’s. In the second photo you see that DeKalb Ave. has no tire tracks and the train station is behind him. Emmett is wearing full winter gear, collecting snow to save for summer. If I gave the waterproof Timberline boots and snowboarding jacket to his mom, we would’ve never seen them again—period.

These experiences were also treated as opportunities for gaslighting by Cheri. Both snowstorms winter fun were twisted as accusations in the document presented to the Guardian ad Litem. The GAL was requested by my attorney in late 2012. And by March 2014, the GAL announced to Cheri and I that she was going to recommend in her final report to the Custody Judge Coursey that we should keep the same 5/5/2/2 equal coparenting schedule after nearly two years of successful coparenting, “things had gone so well, and there had been no conflict.

Cheri saw that as a loss, and about two weeks later presented a seven-page list of allegations **no one had ever seen or heard of—** after years of being in courtrooms related to our custody case. Again, these lies swayed the GAL to reverse her decision, suspending visitation, allowing Cheri to kidnap our son solely so she wouldn’t have to coparent—no other reason.
