
WASHINGTON NATIONAL PARK

Natural Attractions

Mount Washingstone

This stunning monument for which the park was named, is the tallest of nine mountains in the park. Standing at just over 5,200 feet, The diagonal layers of the mountain resemble a 19th century stone washboard.



Spectra Hot Springs

Millennia of geothermal activity have created these beautiful yet dangerous cauldrons; mesmerizing park visitors daily with their with rainbow pools and acidic geysers that continuously steam, bubble, and burst.



Glowing Rock Swamp

Over the centuries, runoff from the geothermal hot springs have created a dense swamp deep in the heart of the park. Here, park visitors have occasionally witnessed the rocks glow in the dark with a mysterious green hue.



Wisperyell Forest




Infinity Valley
