


STEWARDSHIP CORNER

BAPTISMAL GIFTS

"We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life" (Rom. 6:4)

Baptism is a tremendous stewardship concept. Lutherans often don't tend to talk about it much, but our stewardship is driven by our baptismal identity. What makes this even more remarkable is that it takes us back to a point in time when our first parents were NOT faithful stewards.

Re-read Genesis 3. Bible scholars call this chapter the fall into sin. Really, it is more like the first stewardship crisis. Adam and Eve were made for the purpose of stewarding the creation that God had spoken into existence. They didn't own it. They were to serve God by serving as caretakers of creation. But in a beguiling blink of an eye, it all changed. They reached out and took-not just the fruit from the forbidden tree, but they attempted to steal God's place. With this rebellion comes death.

Driven out of the garden, Adam and Eve were never relieved of their duties of stewardship. The work of stewardship would bring only death. That is, until Christ came to do the work that we could never do. He was the PERFECT steward of God's Word and will. His death on the cross and tomb-robbing resurrection changed everything!

Baptism restores our place. Death no longer can hold us. We have new life. This new life is manifest in our stewardship of all things! Our new baptismal life in Christ is a restoration in our stewardship! Baptized into Christ, we live like no one else. As baptized stewards, we then can give of ourselves freely because our ultimate fear, death, has been done away with!

As you remember your Baptism today, remember its call and promise that you have been restored for His purposes as stewards of all things! This is both freeing and purposeful all at the same time!

PRAYER: Lord Jesus Christ, as a perfect steward of God's Word and will, You have opened the door to a restoration of our relationship with the Father. This relationship of stewardship is the one for which we have been created. Grant us Your grace in Holy Baptism to live like redeemed stewards, free from fear and full of generous life for the sake of the Gospel. Amen.

Guatemala Mission Trip

As you read this, we will have come and gone from Guatemala teaching them about Jesus and loving our experience to share His good news.

Thursday afternoon: This will be our largest group of kids, probably over 250. They begin arriving as soon as we have finished our lunch as school is pop up tents for both the adult lessons and the younger kids lessons. There

over. We all help set up a few pop up tents for both the adult lessons and the younger kids lessons. There are some cement bleacher, like steps, in the park on the west side of a building so there will be some shade. The kids don't mind the bright warm sun. We are so much closer to the equator and we notice how bright and warm the sun is. We appreciate any shade available. With the water shortage we are appreciating all the 'wet wipes' we brought along to refresh ourselves after a day in the sun and dust. After setting up our lesson supplies, we welcome the kids and read to them. We bring a book of Spanish and English story books. We read to them and they also read to us. We teach each other words of English and Spanish. Unfortunately, I do not recall any of the words since i don't speak it. I still immensely enjoy the interaction with the kids. They just want someone to be there and give them hugs. It is very rewarding. Mission groups have sent Frisbees and soccer balls, and the some of the kids expend their energy playing with those. They return them when lessons begin.

We are two blocks away from the adult lessons and must remain where we are. It is not safe to walk anywhere without a Guatemalan missionary. We see gang signs on many buildings, abandoned buildings and many people loitering about. The people are very respectful of the faith groups as many of their children and wives attend. While older men attend, many of the younger men have yet to attend. Our American missionary, Kevin, says he is seeing a shift in that as the young boys who had been attending faith lessons are now young adults and are coming to the adult lessons.

We are all escorted back and forth during the afternoon to experience the adult faith lessons. There must be as many adults as there are children in our group! They are singing, praying and reading Bible verses. One of our pastors and a Guatemalan missionary are overseeing the service. They are getting adults to participate by reading Bible lessons and leading prayers. There are not many adults who can read, but some are learning with their kids and as kids grow into adults, more are able to read.

We are also escorted to see the clinic. Our doctor and two nurses have quite a crowd of people waiting. They are patiently attending to each person and at end of day, we wait for them to finish patients before going home. They are exhausted and looking forward to using 'wet wipes' also. We found much humor all week in not having water. God does provide for all our daily needs.

Our lessons went well with the volume of kids. Oscar (Oh-scar) has recruited a few of the older kids to assist. They help quiet the kids, separate squirming kids and help distribute their craft. We are grateful for their help as then we can spend time doing our lesson and helping the kids. They are so proud of their coloring and are excited to take them home. As the kids leave, we greet them at park entrance, give hugs, a sandwich, juice box and vitamins.

We are tired, hot and ready for the van ride back home. We look forward to a delicious meal prepared by Ginny, just the way we like it. That is Kevin's slogan all week. Your meal is served 'just the way you like it.' And we do! We brought

Wisconsin cheese along and we have that with hot pasta, a sauce, plenty of vegetables and salad. Yum.

After supper and clean up, we assemble our lesson plans for next day and have our devotions. A very hot day but so rewarding. God is good.

Not "Bad"

A bit of a rascal when he was younger, one of our elders has had the unfortunate nickname of "Bad" since his childhood. To this day, many people in his own family don't know his real name! Several years ago, when Bad first began attending church, I suggested that Bad should lead worship music at church with his dombira. The other leaders looked at me as if I were crazy and asked what kind of "bad" worship music? As it turns out, "Let 'Bad' lead worship music," and "Let (him) lead bad worship music," are exactly the same in Kazakh! As the meaning of my unintended pun dawned on me we had a good laugh together. From that day on I have insisted on using Bad's real name—"King of Peace" or "Peace" for short—not only to avoid confusion, but also feeling that his real name is more suitable for a follower of Jesus.

Peace is one of the few leaders in our church who is financially independent, thanks to another missionary who helped Peace and his wife turn their artistic abilities into a business, making handcrafted leather bags and sandals to sell to the throngs of tourists that come to Mongolia each year. Peace and his wife invite the other church leaders to meet at their house each week for prayer, often making a meal for their grateful brothers and sisters. I told them that they don't have to go all out if it is a financial burden on them, but they insist that the Lord has blessed them, and they want to serve in this way as the Lord has enabled them.

In addition to hosting the prayer meeting and other leaders' meetings in their house, twice a month Peace goes to a nearby village with our ministry assistant to do evangelism and care for

the young house church there, and beginning this month Peace and two of our other elders are working together to start new home groups in different neighborhoods of their town.

Earlier in January, Peace lead the children's message using our newly translated "Children's Garden of Bible Stories" and has taken the lead in distributing this needed book to the families of our congregation, encouraging other family leaders to have Bible reading and prayer time together each day in their families. (Thanks to the Lutheran Heritage Foundation for making the translation and publication of this wonderful resource possible!) In case you are wondering, yes, Peace also uses his dombira to lead some of the music at church. To say that it is not BAD would be an understatement!
