


#### **UPDATE ON ST. JOHN**

**SERVICES** - With the services not near the capacity, we are going to continue with our current schedule of services. These service times are Saturday at 5:30 PM; Sunday at 9:00 AM and Monday at 6:00 PM. The Saturday and the Sunday services will be live streamed on our Facebook page and the Sunday service will still be on the radio at 11:30 AM on Bluejay 730AM and 96.3FM. We are looking for sponsors for those services on the

radio, please prayerfully consider that.

One major change is that each service will have communion during this time of unrest. The communion will be done in a continuous line fashion, as to limit the contact points for each individual. The practice will be explained at the time of service.

**COMMUNION** – Because of the inclusion of communion in services, we will be cutting back our communion practice during the week. We will be serving communion **ONLY ON Tuesdays: 1-3 PM and 6-8 PM beginning September 8. Please make adjustments to your schedule accordingly.** Pastors are still willing to do communion individually at people's home, just call the church office to schedule those appointments.

**DEVOTIONS** – Our daily devotions on Facebook will also be changed starting in September. A daily devotion will be provided for you Monday through Friday only.


**PROGRAMS** – We are starting up certain programs, and again we are doing them in stages.

**Senior Youth** returns September 9th at its' usual time of 8:00 PM on Wednesday evenings.

*Ladies' Aid* will meet on Thursday, September 3<sup>rd</sup>. This usually is the potluck meal, but not this year. Come for the fellowship and dessert. Wearing of masks is encouraged.

**Wednesday Night Alive** returns on September 9<sup>th</sup>. This year, we are keeping it to 6<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> grade. This will lessen the people here in the church and school and be able to keep things social distant.

We advise that you wear a mask during these programs and maintain social distancing guidelines accordingly.



**Bible Studies – Pastor's Bible Studies on Sunday** will continue in the book of Genesis down in the fellowship hall. During that time, we will be streaming live on our youtube channel. (Yes, we have a youtube channel. Go to youtube.com, search for St. John Lutheran, Merrill, and you will find us and past Bible studies we have streamed). This has already begun, please join us after church service.

Thom Hahn will also begin his **Sunday Bible Study** as well. There will be more information to come.

Monday Morning Bible studies and Thursday Morning Bible studies at First Street Coffee Station will resume and you can participate on zoom for those. Please call the church office to contact the pastors on joining in. Those morning Bible

Studies begin at 7 AM

Women's Afternoon Bible study on Tuesday will return as well on September 8th. Please contact Deaconess Fran at the church office to register for the course.

Thursday Afternoon Bible study with Pastor Bless will return on September 10. This study begins at 12:30 PM.

Again we advise that during these Bible Studies you wear your mask and maintain social distancing guidelines accordingly. Please be advised to contact your Bible Study leader if you are interested in zooming in on the study.

**New Members Classes** are being conducted on individual basis and what that family or individual feels comfortable doing. Please call the pastors or email the pastors to arrange these meetings.

MARK IT DOWN! SEPTEMBER 13th OUTDOOR SERVICE! Because of the restrictions that come with this pandemic, the church picnic which is usually the first Sunday after Labor Day has been cancelled. But the elders agreed that we should still have an outdoor service!

This service will take place in our parking lot. Please bring your lawn chairs for we will not supply chairs for this service. We ask that you come and sit socially distant from each other during service.

During the service, we will be serving communion as well. The pastors will walk around providing communion with an elder behind them picking up the individual cups.

We will also have Bible Study right afterwards, so please plan accordingly.

"The Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many." (Matthew 20:28)

We serve because Jesus served. The Son of Man came to serve as teacher and miracle worker. Jesus came to serve the diseased and distraught. Jesus served by feeding thousands and washing the feet of His disciples. Jesus came to serve little children.

Jesus came to seek, save, and serve sinners. Jesus' ultimate act of service is seen in the cross. The "Sent to Serve" theme and verse from Matthew directs children, faculty, staff, families, and friends who are blessed to worship together at the cross of Jesus.

In 2019, LCMS Youth Ministry published "7 Practices of Healthy Youth Ministry." One of the practices noted is "Serve and Lead." The resource noted, "Young people are watching the church and looking for the love of Christ to overflow to their neighbors" (p. 28). Service doesn't begin with teenagers

after their confirmation. Blessed in the grace of the waters of Baptism, we are the Spirit's instruments to serve from childhood. Children in Lutheran schools are "Sent to Serve."

Rejoicing in the Good News that Jesus was sent to serve, Lutheran school students, teachers and others blessed by the school ministry are then "Sent to Serve" in His name!





The beginning of this school year will look differently and present more challenges than other years. Our Open House will be virtual. Masks will be worn. Although we love having parents, grandparents, and friends in our building for lunch or for volunteering, visitors won't be allowed past the office. We're having three lunch shifts instead of two to keep our students socially distanced. There will be one-way traffic in our hallways. There will be limits on how many students may be in the bathroom at one time. Hand washing and desk sanitizing times have been built into classroom schedules. These are some of the strategies our school will have in place with the goal of keeping our students as safe as possible. ONE THING WILL NOT CHANGE: The love of God will be shared with our students each and every day!



GUATEMALA UPDATE: GEORGE: George Leger is the founder of Only

A Child. He was born and raised in Boston, Massachusetts and was an executive chef at a private country club. George saw a newspaper article about Giovanna, a homeless boy who was murdered by the Guatemala government in 1993. Giovanna had left an abusive home to live on the streets. The police tortured him with their customary brutality, beat him and left his body in a field. George was so moved by this event, he left his very comfortable life to pursue a far less certain path among the crime and poverty of Guatemala City.

George found large numbers of youth who survived by begging and theft and slept on the streets. Many were drug addicts. Many had escaped violent homes finding more violence on the streets from the police. George intended to work with an established organization already in Guatemala, but they did not meet his goals in helping the kids. He founded Only a Child in 1994 as a simple outreach program. He provided for their most basic needs of food, clothing, medical and love. The children began to trust him because he spent time with them daily, talking, listening and giving them the attention they so needed from a loving adult.

He then went on to establish the shelter and carpentry shop helping the youngsters to attend school and learn life skills. All of this was achieved through much trial and despair. But when George tells us his story, and we hear it each time we go to Guatemala, we see his trust and faith in God. He tells us of his prayers, praying constantly, his trust that God will provide in the darkest of times. Many times they were being evicted from the home they were using, or had run out of money to purchase their food for the month. Turning to prayer and trusting God, the answers were always there.

He truly is a loving Christian man who has made a difference in the lives of hundreds of kids. More than 60 youth have lived in the shelter, have learned life skills in the carpentry shop and have been educated in accredited independent

schools, including the university.

All of this is done with God's word and love. There are morning and evening devotions, prayers, church and ministry to other under privileged youth. He teaches them to live their lives centered around God. We visit the carpentry shop on each trip giving us the opportunity to learn about their lives. This year each youth told their story, where they came from, the family they left behind, how they found George and how this ministry has changed their lives. They told us their specific skill in making the

boxes and what their life plans are. It was a very humbling experience for us, who have so much freedom and so many earthly goods.



The boxes are all designed, carved, sanded and stained by the boys. All by hand. They take great pride in their work. They ask us for new ideas and show us ideas they have been working on. Many of you have purchased some of the boxes and crosses. All money from the sale goes back to the ministry. Since COVID-19, their lives have changed drastically. George's recent newsletter highlighted the changes. Guatemala is largely dependent on the government for many things. And when they closed the border and instituted restrictions, people are suffering

Most business and commercial centers are closed except for supermarkets, pharmacies and banks. But they have have limited hours and many restrictions. There is no public transportation and those with cars can only drive them 1 or 2 days a week depending on their license plate numbers. A mandatory curfew from 4pm to 4am each day you must remain INSIDE your home. All schools, churches, social and cultural events have been cancelled. The boys have not seen their families since Christmas due to curfew, transportation issues and restrictions on travel between counties being prohibited. Their counties are like our cities, suburbs, townships etc. You cannot travel outside of the one you live in unless you have government permission.

George has been quarantined with the youth at the shelter home and says he has never felt so isolated. The border to the United States has been closed off and he is solely responsible for watching over 9 young lives. His biggest concern has been that the Department of Health would collapse under a level of demand for care and that is currently happening. Only those with life threatening symptoms are cared for. The boys are keeping current with their studies, eating their meals together, learning to help each other more and spending more time in Bible study, prayer and reflection.

The government has now imposed a fasting and prayer day each Saturday. Each Saturday from 8 am to 12 pm, there is no reading, except the Bible, no technology, no food. George says the boys and him have been personally moved by this experience and they continue the practice each Saturday.

In closing he says" Once again, I turn to my faith, this time to help me face a strange new world that I often struggle to recognize. Once again, my faith does not fail me. I remain calm and at peace, trusting that a Higher Power watches over us all, always. The uncertainty and anxiety we face are known by one and all. No one is spared. Let this be our common ground. One world under God, indivisible....".

PS. They were not able to hold their spring fundraiser in the USA and need our support to continue the mission. They face a long road ahead and request support of their work. You can donate directly on their website or give to church office and we will make sure the funds get to them.

#### THE GIFT OF FAITHFUL STEWARDSHIP:



"Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heavens were opened, and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form, like a dove; and a voice came from heaven, 'You are

my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased".

God was pleased. With whom was He pleased? His son Jesus of course! But have you ever wondered why? What had Jesus done up to this point to cause such pleasure for His Father? Well, He didn't get murdered by Herod. He was in the temple like a good Jewish boy. He hadn't done anything exceptional up to this point. No healings. No teaching. No resurrections. Even in Luke 3, all Jesus does is go down into the water and is baptized by His cousin John. Nothing spectacular to inspire pleasure in the Father has been seen yet.

But that is what gives us the greatest stewardship lesson. Stewardship isn't about the spectacular. You don't have to give millions of dollars to be a Father-pleasing steward. You don't have to go to Africa for mission work to get the same kind of "attaboy" from God. Stewardship that is faithful and God-pleasing is found in everyday life. It is the husband loving his wife because she is a

gift from God. It is a mom feeding her baby in the middle of the night because she has been given this new life to steward. It is a child doing their level best because their talents are gifts from God.

This happens every day. You have been doing it. Simple gifts have been entrusted to you. Your faithful presence in worship, your generosity for the Gospel, the investment in your family with the message of the Gospel and so many other mundane efforts are stewardship. It is your faithfulness to the callings you have been given.

The Father was well pleased with Jesus because of what He had done up to that point. He was also well pleased with what He was going to do. The same is true of you, faithful steward. He is pleased with what you have done and what He knows you will do. He knows you will heed His word and answer His call. He has given you all the grace you need to be His faithful steward. With you He is well pleased.

Prayer: Loving Father, You were well pleased with the faithful work of Your Son both before and after His Baptism in the Jordan. Grant us the grace to be faithful in the stewardship of our daily lives. When we fall short, lead us back to Jesus. We know that it is because of Him that You are pleased with us. Lead us to be faithful stewards of His Gospel every day! Amen.



I recall a night in Liberia, lying safely under my mosquito bed net, marveling at the magnitude of the surrounding darkness. The kind of pitch-black environment where no boundary existed between my outstretched hand and the void surrounding me. It was the perfect conditions for my light-sensitive sleep style. Back home in Massachusetts, I intentionally draw the shades tight to prevent light from waking me.

Occasionally – or perhaps more often than we care to admit – we prefer forms of darkness that hide our faults and failures, that keep

#### BUILDING FUND: BEYOND HALF WAY!



# The Church—Together Again!

Since January the Mongolian government has been very strict in regard to the coronavirus with mandatory mask rules and the closing of theaters, gyms, churches, etc., even limiting work hours of businesses. Borders with all foreign countries are closed, other than evacuation flights. We can't even receive or send mail from America! However, since there have been only 288 cases in the country (all imported), and since there have been no reported deaths or even incountry transmissions of Covid-19, the government has recently been relaxing the regulations a bit, even allowing churches to meet! It was with great joy that we met with our Kazakh brothers and sisters in Christ this past weekend for a church picnic. One of the members invited the church to meet at his family's home outside the capital city of Ulaanbaatar, and over fifty people came! Only around half of our faithful church family in the area was free to join us, but those who came brought friends and relatives with whom they had shared the Gospel who were eager to learn more about a Savior from sin. One lady's husband came for the first time, joining his wife and three young boys in church. I watched as he held up his phone to record the songs we sang together. In talking to his wife afterwards, she said with joy, "He said he is going to come every week! He especially loved the worship time!" And there was

opportunity for much conversation with the other new folks as we played games and shared a meal together after the service. In good Kazakh fashion, the picnic was 9 hours long, and we sat down to not one, but THREE laden tables, including all the special cultural treats like the sheep's head, innards (kidney, liver, etc.), and fermented mare's milk. It was such an encouragement for us to be together as the Body of Christ once again, so this month we will let the pictures tell the rest of the story...
