Historic Heart Of England


Day 1 Home pick-up and travel to Bolsover Castle – created as an extravagant retreat by playboy, poet and courtier, Sir William Cavendish. With medieval-style turrets and towers, it was a building designed to surprise and delight.

Day 2 Visit the City of Caves. Nottingham has over 800 caves hidden beneath its streets. Discover one of the largest sections of the vast underground network by way of a guided tour. After time for lunch depart for Nottingham Castle – known across the world as the backdrop for Robin Hood's tussles with the dastardly Sheriff of Nottingham.

Day 3 Today we head to the heart of the Derwent Valley and Cromford. Here enjoy a canal boat cruise, explore the iconic restored mills and experience industrial innovation that transformed how we all live and work. This afternoon we will visit Bakewell with time to explore.

Day 4 Check out and depart for Belvoir Castle. Step into the magnificent State Rooms, where centuries of history, art, and royal heritage come together in stunning displays of architectural and decorative excellence.

Blooming Bulbfields

Day 1 Home pick-up and travel to Hull for mid afternoon to catch the overnight ferry to Rotterdam.

Day 2 Disembark after breakfast and head to Keukenhof Gardens. Every year more than 7 million flowers, 800 varieties, are planted by hand, creating a unique world famous spectacle.

Day 3 An early start this morning as we depart for Royal FloraHolland – the worlds largest flower auction and an icon of global trade in floral beauty. Travel to Medemblik a charming village at the most northerly point of the golden triangle. From here take a heritage train ride Hoorn.

Day 4 A journey inland to Het

Loo Palace. Formerly the summer residence of the Dutch royal family and now a museum where you can see how its former residents lived and worked. The garden is among the most beautiful in Europe and the coach houses showcase a collection of royal cars and carriages used in historic moments.

Day 5 Check out and depart for Kasteel De Haar, the largest and most luxurious castle in the Netherlands. Take time to see the castle and learn about its history, see the impressive collection of special art objects before travelling back to Rotterdam and the overnight ferry to England.

Day 1 Home pick-up and travel to Beaulieu for 4 nights dinner bed and breakfast.

Day 2 Embark on a journey up the Far North Line from Dingwall to Dunrobin to meet the coach. This railway provides scenic, unique and dramatic views of the highlands. After disembarking we will travel the short journey to the magnificent Dunrobin Castle, the most northerly of Scotland's great houses. Visit the state rooms, formal gardens and Victorian Museum.

Day 3 Today's visit is to the award winning Inverewe Gardens, located on the north west coast – part of the North Coast 500 route. See pre-historic trees such as Wollemi pines,

rhododendrons, Himalayan poppies and Tasmanian eucalyptus. There are many amazing species that simply shouldn't grow here and are thriving, aided by the effects of the Gulf Stream.

Day 4 Travel to Fort William today for a spectacular one way train ride to Mallaig on the Jacobite steam train. Encounter the stunning scenery as you travel past Loch Eil, Loch Shiel, Loch Eilt and over the Glenfinnan Viaduct's 21 arches. Upon arriving in the fishing village of Mallaig we will meet the coach and take the ferry across to Armadale on the Isle of Skye followed by a scenic drive back to Beaulieu.

Day 5 Check out and depart for Yorkshire.

Hebridean Odyssey

Day 1 Home pick up. Depart for our hotel in Ullapool for one night stay's with comfort stops en route.

Day 2 Today is ferry dependant. We will either spend the day on the mainland with a scenic drive and time in Ullapool before catching the early evening ferry with dinner on board, or alternatively, we will catch the morning ferry followed by a scenic drive on Lewis. After check in at the Cabarfeidh hotel for a 2 night stay.

Day 3 We will be joined by a local guide who will take us around the Isle of Lewis. An opportunity to explore the island with an included visit to Gearrannan Black Houses Village.

Lewis is the most northerly island of the Hebrides and the largest island of the

Outer Hebrides. Lewis has a history that goes back thousands of years and ancient stone circles and standing stones can be found everywhere. On the west coast of the Isle of Lewis, at Callanish, stands the awesome collection of stone circles and rows of standing stones called the 'Hebrides' Stonehenge'. Other sights to see on your excursion around Lewis include the moorland interior, where peat is still cut for fuel, traditional croft dwellings and Carloway Broch, one of Scotland's best preserved defensive structures dating back 2,000 years.

Day 4 The first leg of today's journey is from Lewis to Harris, then continuing down the west coast past numerous unspoilt, white sandy beaches and some of the

most breathtakingly beautiful scenery in the Western Isles. We will then board the afternoon ferry for the 80 minute crossing to Berneray, before continuing on to The Dark Island Hotel, Benbecula for 3 nights stay.

North Uist, a relatively flat island covered with peat bogs, low hills and lochans. More than half the land is covered by water, making North Uist a birdwatchers' paradise. We have included a packed lunch on this day.

Day 5 Local coach today for a scenic drive. Today's island hopping begins by taking the causeway across to South Uist, where the west coast is a continuous sandy beach while the east is dominated by mountainous peaks. On then via a further causeway to Eriskay. Eriskay is famous for the Eriskay Ponies and is also the real 'Whisky Galore' island. It was just off Eriskay, between Great Todday and Little Todday, that the S.S. Politician ran aground in 1941 with 50,000 cases of whisky aboard. The locals managed to save several hundred cases before the ship sank, providing them with a good supply of their 'Water of Life'. From here, enjoy the short ferry crossing to the

Isle of Barra which is considered by many to be the most beautiful little island in Britain. Its tranquil beaches, distinctive culture, where Gaelic is widely spoken, and an ancient history make any visit to Barra a memorable one. Packed lunch included.

Day 6 Local guide today as we tour around Benbecula's Kildonan Museum. This Museum holds over 10,000 items related to the social, domestic and cultural history of South Uist. Also an included visit to North Uist Distillery for a short talk and tasting.

Benbecula is small, flat, low-lying and dotted with lochs and lochans and is linked by causeway to the neighbouring Uists. The island is blessed with some cracking beaches, backed by sand dunes and the machair wildflowers, typical of the Hebrides.

Day 7 Today we take the ferry from Lochmaddy to Uig. From here we will then continue our scenic drive to Aonach Mor Mountain for a closed cabin gondola ride 650m up the mountain.

Day 8 Homeward journey back to Yorkshire via Lowther Castle and Gardens.

Great Houses Of Three Counties

Day 1 Home pick-up followed by a day of steam at Didcot Railway Centre. Spend the day immersing yourselves in the living museum of the Great Western Railway from the 1932 Engine shed, towering Coal Stage to the magnificently restored coaches dating back to the Victorian times.

Day 2 A local guide today for a tour by coach around the historic city of Bath. Founded by the Romans, and a world heritage sight since 1987 it's home to Britain's only natural thermal baths! Later there will be time for lunch,

Day 3 Rodmorton Manor today. Receive a short introduction to this fascinating house with its original interiors. All made in the early 20th-century it is a good example of the furniture, ceramics, ironwork and textiles all made by followers of the Cotswold

Arts and Crafts movement. Refreshments included here.

Day 4 Today's excursion – Bowood House set within 100 acres of beautifully landscaped 'Capability' Brown Parkland. Surrounding the Georgian House is the Italian-inspired terrace garden, walled garden and herbaceous border. This afternoon is to Reme Museum, a modern interactive museum telling the story of the Royal Electrical and Mechanical Engineers in the 20th and 21st Century.

Day 5 Travel north to Blenheim Palace. Built between 1705 and 1722 this palace boasts a long and diverse history. Discover an abundance of breathtaking views, charming corners, natural beauty and picturesque spots at Britain's Greatest Palace. Return to Yorkshire in the evening.

Welsh Wonders

Day 1 Home pick-up and travel to Tewkesbury Abbey. We will be treated to a guided tour of this Norman Church. Learn all about its interesting history dating back to when it was founded in 1087.

Day 2 A full day today at St Fagans National Museum of History, one of Europe's leading open-air museums, is this morning's visit. A welcome talk from a curator followed by time to explore the collection at your own pace.

Day 3 Begin the day with a guided tour underground at the Big Pit to see what life was like for the thousands of men who worked at the coal face. From here visit Tintern Abbey – still standing in roofless splendour on the banks of the River Wye.

Day 4 Llanover Gardens in the beautiful Usk Valley for a walking tour and refreshments this morning. Eight generations of the same family have lived here and looked after the gardens since 1792. With Lavish herbaceous borders, wildflower meadows and striking displays in vast urns and troughs. Take a scenic drive through the valley to Dean Forest Railway for a return journey from Norchard to Lydney Junction this afternoon.

Day 5 Homeward journey via Burghley House. Discover one of the grandest houses of the 16th Century and its magical estate. Burghley is a testament to the ambition and vision of the most powerful courtier of the first Elizabethan age.

Welsh Gardens and Trains

Day 1 Home pick-up and travel to The Runway Visitor Centre to explore the famous concorde G-BOAC. Sit in the luxury leather seats as your Concorde tour guide tells the story of the aircraft's years of history. A visit to the flight deck is included.

Day 2 We will take a once in a lifetime heritage railway adventure to the summit of Snowdon, the majestic mountain with breathtaking views. Travel to Angelsey for Plas Cadnant Hidden Gardens. Three different gardens have been discovered here including an unusual walled garden with curving walls and pool, a secret valley garden with three waterfalls and a beautiful ancient woodland.

Day 3 Bodnant Gardens this morning. Founded in 1874 this magnificent garden has been developed over the

generations and spans over 80 acres. With intimate corners, sweeping lawns, grand terraces and verdant woodland, there are many gardens in one here.

Day 4 Ffestiniog Railway today. Travel from Porthmadog for a single rail journey to the slate quarrying town of Blaenau Ffestiniog. The historic train ascends over 700 feet, passing through tranquil meadows, past waterfalls and around horseshoe bends.

Day 5 Depart for the National Waterways Museum, Ellesmere Port. Originally designed by Thomas Telford, this 200-year old historic dock is one of the largest and most complete dock complexes in the UK. It is well placed to tell the story of the growth of the Industrial Revolution in Britain. A guided tour is included here.

Upon receipt by us of your deposit, we shall send you a confirmation letter. The final balance will be due at the latest **9 weeks** before the departure date. Any bookings made after this point will be require to pay the full amount at the time of booking. Every person making a booking on behalf of a passenger or group of passengers warrants and confirms that he/she has authority of that passenger and that each such passenger agrees to be bound by these terms and conditions.
- (2). Any cancellation must be notified to us in writing by the person who made the booking. If you cancel your holiday: More than 49 days prior to the start of your holiday, you will only be charged your deposit. Between 49 and 42 days, you will be charged 50% of the holiday cost. Between 42 and 35 days, you will be charged 75% of the holiday cost. Less than 35 days before the start of your holiday or on or after the commencement of the holiday, you will be charged the full holiday cost. Should this occur, we advise you to seek recompense from your travel insurer. Note: we do realize that unforeseen circumstances may arise meaning that you have to cancel your holiday. connected with this contract shall be governed by the UK/European law. We will liaise with our suppliers, investigate and provide you with a response within no more than 24 days following receipt of your written notification.

(11). Subject to consultation we reserve the right to vary the holiday in any way we consider preferable due to adverse weather or any other conditions. It is a fundamental booking condition that taking part in this sort of holiday means there is an element of travel flexibility.
