




Home Pick Up Areas

Day 1 Travel to Sidmouth for 4 nights stay.

Day 2 This morning we travel to Exmouth for a late morning Circular cruise. We will travel on tranquil waters past Powderham Castle, Lympstone, Starcross and Turf Lock, before pausing at Topsham Quay to begin the return journey, followed by free time to explore the city.

Day 3 Morning travel to Exeter for a guided tour of this 12th to 14th century romanesque style Catherdral. Later we travel to the award winning world heritage Bicton Botanical Gardens. With over 60 acres of beautiful gardens, their soft sweeping lawns, elegant water features, fragrant English borders and formal gardens - there's lots to see here. Cream tea is included on this day.

Day 4 Travel to Seaton for an included return tram ride on the Seaton Tramway to Colyton a 3 mile nostalgic journey along the River Axe. Free time in Sidmouth to enjoy the seafront, picturesque Connaught Gardens or the town with its delightful floral features and individual shops.

Day 1 We start off today with a visit to Drumlanrig Castle and Gardens for a guided tour before heading to Larkhall for 4 nights stay.

Day 2 Full day excursion to the Isle of Bute sailing from Wemyss Bay to Rothesay. Take a scenic tour of the island with a stop at Mount Stuart, an outstanding and flamboyant Victorian, Gothic style mansion with beautiful gardens within a 300 acre estate.

Day 3 Take the morning sailing across the Clyde to Dunoon on the Cowal Peninsula. Visit Benmore Botanic Garden dramatically set in the mountains of the Loch

Lomond and Trossachs National Park. This afternoon is an included cruise on Loch Lomond.

Isle of Barra • Eriskay • Benbecula • Harris • Beautiful Beaches • Uist • Isle of Lewis • Callanish

Day 1 Head north to Stirling for free time before checking into the King Robert for 1 night. Stirling is home to internationally-acclaimed tourist attractions which have seen the most defining and dramatic moments in Scotland's history.

Day 2 Depart hotel to continue our journey north through the rolling hills past the Cairngorms National Park to Ullapool stopping in Inverness along the way. Located in the Scottish Highlands, there are plenty of sightseeing opportunities in the form of Victorian–era marketplaces, cathedrals, and museums. We will catch an afternoon ferry to Stornoway with dinner on board before continuing on to the Cabarfeidh hotel for 3 nights stay.

Day 3 & 4 We will be joined by a local guide who will be taking us around the Isle of Lewis for both of these days. We will explore the island making an included visit to Gearrannan Black Houses Village.

Lewis is the most northerly island of the Hebrides and the largest island of the Outer Hebrides. Lewis has a history that goes back thousands of years and ancient stone circles and standing stones can be found everywhere. On the west coast of the Isle of Lewis, at Callanish, stands the awesome

collection of stone circles and rows of standing stones called the 'Hebrides' Stonehenge'. Other sights to see on your excursion around Lewis include the moorland interior, where peat is still cut for fuel, traditional croft dwellings and Carloway Broch, one of Scotland's best preserved defensive structures dating back 2,000 years.

Day 5 The first leg of today's journey is from Lewis to Harris, then continuing down the west coast past numerous unspoilt, white sandy beaches and some of the most breathtakingly beautiful scenery in the Western Isles. We will then board the afternoon ferry for the 80 minute crossing to Berneray, before continuing on to The Dark Island Hotel, Benbecula for 3 nights stay.

North Uist, a relatively flat island covered with peat bogs, low hills and lochans. More than half the land is covered by water, making North Uist a birdwatchers' paradise. We have included a packed lunch on this day.

Day 6 Local coach today. Today's island hopping begins

by taking the causeway across to South Uist, where the west coast is a continuous sandy beach while the east is dominated by mountainous peaks. On then via a further causeway to Eriskay. Eriskay is famous for the Eriskay Ponies and is also the real 'Whisky Galore' island. It was just off Eriskay, between Great Todday and Little Todday, that the S.S. Politician ran aground in 1941 with 50,000 cases of whisky aboard. The locals managed to save several hundred cases. before the ship sank, providing them with a good supply of their 'Water of Life'. From here, enjoy the short ferry crossing to the Isle of Barra which is considered by many to be the most beautiful little island in Britain. Its tranquil beaches, distinctive culture, where Gaelic is widely spoken, and an ancient history make any visit to Barra a memorable one.

Day 7 Local guide today as we tour around Benbecula's Kildonan Museum. This Museum holds over 10,000 items related to the social, domestic and cultural history of South Uist.

Benbecula is small, flat, lowlying and dotted with lochs and lochans and is linked by causeway to the neighbouring Uists. The island is blessed with a some cracking beaches, backed sand dunes and the machair typical of the Hebrides.

Day 2 First stop today is a visit to Bodnant Foods. Opened in 2012, the vast centre is a development of traditional 18th century farm buildings and includes a bakery, dairy and extensive farm shop. On then to Bodnant Gardens this afternoon. These gardens, which were created over 150 years, offer a haven of rarity and beauty with a stunning backdrop of the Carneddau mountains of Eryri (Snowdonia) is a delight for the senses.

Day 3 Experience the highs and lows of Snowdonia National Park today. Begin the day with a journey on the narrow gauge Llanberis Lake Railway. Following time at leisure, take

an included trip on the Snowdon Mountain Railway and savour breath taking views from the summit.

Day 4 Spend more time in the lovely city of Caernarfon, with included admission to its dominating castle. Time allowing we will venture across the Menai Straits and tour the wonderful Isle of Anglesey with its beautiful scenery, bays and beaches. Stop in Llanfairpwllgwyngyllgogerych wyrndrobwllllantysiliogogogoch, famous for having the longest town name in Europe.

Day 5 On the return to Yorkshire we visit Erddig House and Gardens. A much loved home and garden filled with stories of the family and their servants. Preserved rooms capture life in the 20th Century. Outside exuberant borders and unusual trained fruit trees. 10th 14th June

Day 4 A visit to the remarkable Shuttleworth Collection today. Here they have an amazing collection of vintage aircraft and motor vehicles dating from 1909-1950 for us to explore. This afternoon is spent in their beautiful Swiss garden. Set in 9 acres of regency landscape with seasonal planting and resident peacocks, its a delight on the senses. Lunch and guided tour is included here.

Day 1 Home pick up and travel to Holyhead for an afternoon crossing to Dublin and continue on to City North Hotel for 1 night stay.

Day 2 A long but worthwhile day as we head south to Kilkenny Castle, overlooking the town of Kilkenny and the River Nore. A symbol of Norman control, Kilkenny Castle came to symbolise the fortunes of the powerful Butlers of Ormonde for over six hundred years. From here we continue on to County Cork with a visit to Cobh, known from 1849 until 1920 as Queenstown, is a seaport town on the south coast of

County Cork, Ireland. This was also the final port of call for the Titanic before she met her fate in 1912. On then to Clonakilty for 4 nights stay.

Day 3 A scenic journey via Mizen Head to Bantry for free time to explore the beautiful harbor town this morning. On then to Glengariff for a boat trip to Garnish Island where visitors will see the effects of its unique micro climate and possibly its colony of seals. The island is renowned for its richness of plant form and colour, which change continuously with the seasons. Pathways wind around the landscape, leading to a

> number of fascinating garden buildings, such as the Grecian temple, the clock tower, the casita, and an original Martello Tower.

> Day 4 Today is a free day to enjoy the facilities at the hotel and this friendly town. A leisurely walk will find you in the town centre with access to Clonakilty Distillery, West Cork Model Railway Village and Michael Collins House Museum. For the more adventurous, why not visit the Clonakilty Blackpudding Visitor Centre, who make the most popular black pudding in Ireland with their secret recipe.

Day 5 Visit the vibrant city of Cork, the second largest city in the Republic of Ireland. Cork features architecturally notable buildings originating from the Medieval to Modern periods. Enjoy time here for shopping and sightseeing amongst the colourful





buildings on the banks of the river. Visit the famous English Market selling Cork's artisan produce, and see the spectacular Saint Fin Barre's Cathedral. This afternoon visit Blarney Castle. Brimming with mystery, history and culture, Blarney Castle is home to one of Ireland's most magical attractions - the legendary Blarney Stone. One of the most famous castles on the island, Blarney is a romantic partial ruin set in glorious countryside. Built on the site of a 10th century wooden structure, the castle grounds are filled with wooded hollows, strange rock formations and a glistening flowing river.

Day 6 Depart hotel and journey north through the Irish countryside, for an evening ferry back to England with dinner on board. Continue on to hotel in Chester.

Terms And Conditions

Please note that by booking onto one of our holidays/tours you are agreeing to the following

terms with Murgatroyd Of Harrogate Ltd:

(1). A reservation is not booked until the completed Booking form and deposit fee has been received by us. Deposits for UK tours are £80 per person, European tours including Ireland are £100 per person. Provisional bookings by phone or e-mail will be held for 10 days pending receipt of the Booking form and deposit. Should any ticketed venue be included in the tour, the ticket cost may be payable at the time of booking, the cost will be printed on the itinerary. Upon receipt by us of your deposit, we shall send you a confirmation letter. The invoice for the balance will be sent to you and final balance will be due at the latest **9 weeks** before the departure date. Any bookings made after this point will be require to pay the full amount at the time of booking. Every person making a booking on behalf of a passenger or group of passengers warrants and confirms that he/she has authority of that passenger and that each such passenger agrees to be bound by these terms and conditions.

(2). Any cancellation must be notified to us in writing by the person who made the booking. If you cancel your holiday: More than 42 days prior to the start of your holiday, you will only be charged your deposit. Between 42 and 30 days, you will be charged 50% of the holiday cost. Between 30 and 14 days, you will be charged 75% of the holiday cost. Less than 14 days before the start of your holiday or on or after the commencement of the holiday, you will be charged the full holiday cost. should this occur, we advise you to seek recompense from your travel insurer. Note: we do realize that unforeseen circumstances may arise meaning that you have to cancel your holiday. With this in mind, we strongly advise that you take out

appropriate travel/holiday insurance at the time of booking.

(3). Murgatroyd Of Harrogate Itd complies with statutory regulations regarding all client's monies held until the holiday has been delivered, this includes and is where sufficient funds are held to repatriate clients, if required, in the event of operational failure. We also hold an additional tour Operators Financial Failure Insurance, to the value of £5,000,000.00 which covers errors, financial losses, injury, illness & damage.

(4). Scheduled departures/holidays may also be cancelled up to 6/4 weeks in advance of the departure date if insufficient bookings have been made. If this is the case, we will endeavour

to offer an alternative replacement holiday or a full refund of monies paid.

(5). Persons, whether an individual or party, booking the holiday, are responsible for the whole of the fee he/she has undertaken to pay and must pay the balance at 10 weeks before the start of the holiday period. If for any reason, the person cancels the booking this must be in writing and he/she remains responsible for the whole of the fee (subject to clause 2). It may be possible for you to transfer your booking to another individual with our prior agreement. Otherwise, we will make every effort to resell the accommodation and if able to do so, will refund the deposit and any other money paid minus any administration cost and any other expenses incurred. Again, in view of the above conditions, we strongly recommend that you consider a separate holiday cancellation insurance policy, which is available from several independent insurers and brokers.

(6). We will ensure any coach used by us holds the full liability insurance policy requirements for bodily injury or accident to passengers on board, for a maximum of £10,000,000 in respect of any one incident. Our insurance does not cover passengers who are away from the coach. We do not accept responsibility for loss of or damage to passengers' personal belongings, property or valuables whilst onboard or in transit, so please check your own household/travel insurance policy to make sure that you are adequately covered in this respect.

(7). No children under the age of 16 shall be carried without the responsibility of their

parents/guardians at all times.

(8). No animals to be carried, with the exception of registered Assistance dogs (pet passport

will be required for travel outside UK).

(9). No drugs, other unlawful substances or goods or materials are permitted on board the vehicle and the passenger(s) shall free and release the vehicle, company and staff from any liabilities or responsibility arising out of any breach of this condition.

(10). In the unlikely event that you have a complaint please report it immediately to a member of our staff so that we may deal with it promptly and hopefully, to your satisfaction. We respectfully reminded you that minor problems that may occur during a tour, particularly at hotels, can often only be satisfactorily resolved at the time. Any subsequent complaint made to us may, by that time, be impossible to deal with to your satisfaction. If this is unable to be rectified at the time, then any issue must be reported in writing to the office within 6 days of occurrence. If you do not report any incident whilst on holiday then this will have an effect on any future claim that you may make. Any legal action or proceedings arising out of or

connected with this contract shall be governed by the UK/European law. We will liaise with our suppliers, investigate and provide you with a response within no more than 24 days following receipt of your written notification.

(11). Subject to consultation we reserve the right to vary the holiday in any way we consider preferable due to adverse weather or any other conditions. it is a fundamental booking condition that taking part in this sort of holiday that there is an element of travel flexibility. The itineraries stated on our website and literature are indicative only and not a guarantee that a particular route will be followed or place reached. You must acknowledge that delays and alterations and their results, such as inconvenience and discomfort, are possible where unforeseen circumstances arise. Ultimate decisions regarding the safety of the vehicle, it's passengers and/or staff on board rest with the driver.

(12). All passengers must be able to walk up at least 6 steps unaided to board the coach and must wear seatbelts whilst the vehicle is in transit, in accordance with UK/EC regulations-10/01. We recommend the WC on the coach is only to be used as an emergency facility and all children under the age of 13 must be supervised by an adult. The coaches will make regular comfort stops.
