Dear Friends

Steere House is pleased to present our Annual Report for 2014.

This year we draw on the foresight of our Founder and first Board President, Henry J. Steere. His devotion to the Providence community during the post-Civil War years led him to play a major role in establishing both Rhode Island Hospital and the Home for Aged Men. Henry Steere was a true visionary whose legacy survives to this day. His commitment to success and compassion for those in need of care and assistance reflects the best of Rhode Islanders.

In this same spirit, our team has worked hard this year to deliver quality and compassionate care to our residents in the face of the significant challenges presented by today's post-acute services environment. As an example, the implementation of the new electronic medical record system demanded we invest time, talent and a hefty dose of passion to make this next great leap. Over 2,000 hours were dedicated to building and customizing the system, as well as training virtually every care team member – from the certified nursing assistants to doctors to business office personnel. We are grateful that our team embraced learning new skills, worked continuously on improvements, while sharing the best of themselves with our residents. We also appreciate the support of our generous donors, grant sources and resident family members who helped us to make this a successful journey. And of course, we can never forget our wonderful residents who remain the centerpiece of Steere House.

IMPORTANT 2014 ACHIEVEMENTS:

- Implementation of the MatrixCare Elite system
- Wer \$53,500 raised to purchase a fourteen-passenger lift bus, made possible with Annual Appeal Campaign donor support, grants and other donations
- More than \$10,000 raised by the Employee Development Team to support improvements of resident daily life, including \$3,475 for an automatic door opener for outdoor courtyard access from the Activity Room
- Grant awards totaling \$139,000 from: the Champlin Foundations to begin a multi-year, window replacement project, starting with the main resident common areas in 2015; the Fred M. Roddy Foundation, used to provide EMR staff training; Ocean State Charities Trust with funds for a new bladder scanner purchase and the Royal Little Family Foundation in support of our van campaign
- Donors supported our mission with nearly \$114,000
- Again, over 2,500 hours of volunteer time, with special gratitude to Johnson & Wales University students

Upon reflection, one cannot help but admire the energy that was required by Henry Steere and the generations of Steere Family members to contribute so much to make Rhode Island a better place. As we plan for the future of long term care, Henry Steere would ask us to see the opportunity and be thoughtful in our business strategies, while remaining true to those who call Steere House home. We have no intention of letting him down.

treasurer's report

This Years was one of relative prosperity and operating efficiency for Steere House. As the economy continued to stabilize, our investments continued to grow. Steere House is very fortunate to have significant investments that supplement our income base. Also in 2014, the Transitional Care Unit was operating fully and consistently admitted patients in higher numbers. Steere House is appreciative of its positive reputation both for rehabilitative services as well as long term care of residents with serious memory problems. As we review the past year, we can be confident in our strong financial position and proud to be offering excellent care to older adults during their time of need. The total net operating revenue for Medicare, Medicaid, commercial insurers, and private pay residents was \$10,972,521 compared to operating expenses of \$11,958,470 for an operating loss of \$985,949. This compares to a 2013 operating loss of \$1,233,980. Net investment income gains of \$1,338,592 in 2014 (compared to a net gain of \$925,546 in 2013) resulted in a net gain of \$919,437 in 2014 compared to a net gain of \$268,252 in 2013. - Respectfully Submitted, Norma Owens, Treasurer

This Year marks the fifth time the Outstanding Steere House Employee Award has recognized someone within the Steere House Community. This year's recipient is Carmen Garcia, a certified nursing assistant (CNA) who joined Steere House three years ago.

What is so special about Carmen? No words on a page can adequately convey the energy and positive attitude that Carmen possesses and so readily shares. Her smile? Infectious. A resident once described her as "a smiling ray of sunshine." Her willingness to help? Appreciated. Steere House is an independent non-profit organization, serving adults who require skilled, restorative and long-term care services within a secure and caring environment.



A LEGACY OF SERVICE






Thenry J. Steere and Lucy Bucklin founded the Home for Aged Men in 1874 on Point Street in Providence (pictured on our front cover). At the January 1875 session of the Rhode Island General Assembly, a charter of incorporation was received for the Home. Steere served as the corporation's first president. His Presidency was part of his long legacy of community philanthropy and leadership. Steere also served as the first Treasurer and a founder of Rhode Island Hospital during this time.

To meet the growing demand for accommodations, the Home was moved in 1882 to a second residence (pictured above). Steere bought, repaired and furnished the Home at the corner of Chestnut and Clifford Streets.

Dreaming of expanding the Home to meet the needs of the community, Steere left \$150,000 upon his death in 1889. His gift would be valued over \$3.8 million in today's dollars. This generous legacy allowed the new "Home" to be built on Broad Street and opened in 1895. In 1908, the Home expanded its mission to include the admittance of couples, and ultimately single women, as residents.





Over the years, changes occurred gradually and the stately structure was no longer designed for the frailties of the elders residing there. Therefore, a new facility opened on the campus of Rhode Island Hospital at 100 Borden Street in January of 1991. The facility was renamed Steere House Nursing and Rehabilitation Center in honor of the visionary man who influenced health services in Providence during his lifetime and the century to come.
