pring has finally sprung here at Steere House and we are pinching ourselves thinking, "Can summer be far behind?" We can only hope so, if the beauty of hydrangea and the sound of happy birds are going to grace the courtyards surrounding our building. Another sign of warmer weather is

the ongoing activity outside in our largest courtyard off the main dining room – the first phase of a two-part effort to address and improve the courtyards that are such a unique feature to our facility.

Recently we excavated the main courtyard to totally clear it of walkways, benches and plantings. We did this to begin addressing issues with the roof of the underground garage which serves as the courtyard's foundation.

Repairing the roof will provide a stronger base for the courtyard. Of course, while this part of the project is important, the truly fun part will come when we can install the hard- and soft -scape design with new walkways that feature more walker and wheelchair friendly surfaces and

plantings.

Our vision for this and the other courtyards surrounding the building doesn't stop there, however, and offers you an opportunity to help. These areas are intended to provide outdoor spaces to enjoy the fresh air, sunshine and a chance to simply watch the world go by. To

maximize the access and beauty of these spaces, we would like to improve the seating options, the permanent shade structures and refresh our plants with new shrubs and garden décor.

## OSCT and Royal Little Foundation Award Phone System Grants

Steere House was awarded a \$5,000 grant from Ocean State Charities Trust (OSCT) and a \$7,000 grant from the Royal Little Family Foundation during their most recent funding cycles. These two awards added to the funds raised during our 2018 Annual Appeal and event proceeds. As a result of our Community's generosity, we were able to raise the \$75,000 needed to purchase a modern phone communications system — one which encompasses business phones, over 20 wireless phones for clinical professionals and support staff and improved in-room phone service to our 120 residents.

Now with the system installed, we have been able to deliver direct dial service (and expand the total number of lines) by allowing those who call Steere House home to make local calls outside the facility and receive calls at their bedside at any time. We have also improved the service of administrative lines, enhancing communication between staff, resident family members, as well as other medical professionals.

Replacing the system was important to our nursing home operations and the safety of our residents. We appreciate the support we received from these two foundations and our individual donors who were able to make this project possible.
