Moses wrote Psalm 90 from the wilderness of Israel's profound faithlessness, then he prayed "Teach us to number our days—that we may gain a heart of wisdom" (Psalm 90:12). Amid the challenges posed by a persistent pandemic, we have so much to be thankful for. Our doors remained open, and we had beautiful worship experiences, starting with a healing service in support of those for whom the holidays can be difficult for different reasons, our Sunday School children ably prepared by their teachers and parents, did wonderful Christmas presentation, and the week before that they did the "hanging of the greens". Inspiring was the Live Nativity Scene outdoor for Church and Community. Candlelight Services were held both at the Three Mile Bay Church and the Cape Vincent Church. Following the Christmas Eve Service, I traveled to Columbus, OH where I spent four amazing days with my two sons, their fiancées, my two amazing grandsons and their extended families.

May we be blessed to see God fulfill this prayer in all our lives. May God grant each of us the wisdom to number and invest our days in things that last forever! I pray that we will all learn to number our days. With Jesus into the world, we are given a new way to live and a new attitude for life as individuals and a family of God. We need to remember in this New Year that with God, all things are possible! Abundant blessings to you and your loved ones for 2022 and beyond!!

Covenant Service

Traditionally, Methodists hold an annual Covenant Service, at which we celebrate all that God has done for us and affirm that we give our lives and choices to God. The traditional Covenant prayer (shown below) makes it very clear that this affirmation is a serious one that embraces the whole of our life, in all its parts. Most people find it quite tough to say, and really mean it. But the prayer is so central to the Christian life that other Churches have also adopted it. It is about surrendering to God in love and joy. (there is a brief history of this Service, instituted by John Wesley)

On January 2, our congregations were invited to renew their covenant with God, and below are the Covenant words:

ie Covenant Prayer

I am no longer my own but yours.
Put me to what you will,
rank me with whom you will;
put me to doing,
put me to suffering;
let me be employed for you,
or laid aside for you,
exalted for you,
or brought low for you;
let me be full,
let me be empty,
let me have all things,
let me have nothing:
I freely and wholeheartedly yield all things



to your pleasure and disposal.
And now, glorious and blessed God,
Father, Son and Holy Spirit,
you are mine and I am yours. So be it.

And the covenant now made on earth, let it be ratified in heaven.'






Upcoming Events and Services
