Debris Pile Pick-Up

If you have piled debris in front of your property expecting Waste Connections to pick it up in the regular trash, it will not go that way. Waste Connections, our regular trash men, will pick up anything in cans and bags. Piles of debris and even bundles of storm debris (like styrofoam) they are leaving. But if you get some big bags, and bag up the debris, they will take it when they pick up the trash. In fact they have been picking up more than the six bags they say you are allowed. I tried this at my house, they ignored the bundles of styrofoam for three weeks, but as soon as I bagged it, boom! They pick up all 13 big bags in one go!

The County is Slooowly starting to gather tree debris from piles, but at the rate they are going (they have to cut all the debris into manageable sized chucks with chainsaws as they go, then handle it into the one truck to haul away) it will be months before they make it here!

And not to scare anyone unduly, but there are not one, but two depressions being watched in the Caribbean right now for development into possible storm in the next week. We pray they do not turn into anything, we pray really hard that they die where they are! But if we should get another storm come through all that debris becomes potential projectiles.

The cleanup around the park and Zephyrhills continues, but looks like it will take quite a while to get back to normal. Meanwhile, here are some things I have found:

HOT NEWS Department of State Disaster Assistance crews are going street by street and reeling residents that **FEMA HAS OPENED AN OFFICE IN THE ZEPHYRHILLS COURTHOUSE** for any disaster victims who need to file for assistance. Yes, FEMA requires you to file for insurance if you have it. But if you know/suspect your claim is not going to cover your repairs, you may want to file for FEMA now. Besides, you can qualify for \$750 in food assistance, housing assistance and medical assistance if you have storm related medical costs. You will need your ID, and your checking information if you want any checks you do get direct deposited.

**IMPORTANT NOTICE FROM FEMA: FEMA reps WILL NOT contact you by email or on the phone, they WILL NOT ask for money or credit cards, they WILL come directly to your home to observe damage in adjusting your claim.

The dump on Hadcart Road is still taking storm debris at no cost to Pasco County residents.

Pasco County utility crews are out on the roads in Zephyrhills picking up the tree debris. They are currently working in the streets around Zephyr Lake. A couple of crews with chain saws are working ahead of the big box truck with a crew tossing the stuff in. They are leaving neat piles of anything Not tree related (fencing, furniture, foam, etc.) behind, I assume for another crew to pick up later.

On the HOA side of things, I will be giving a financial report at the first Board meeting & and at the first HOA meeting, spoiler alert, we are still in good shape!
