Thank you to everyone who has paid their annual dues, or has started a payment plan for semi-annual, quarterly or monthly payments. Please be aware that your 2nd quarterly payment of \$155 is due April, 2024 (grace period is April 30); second semi payment of \$305 and 3rd quarterly payment of \$155 are due

It is my goal to have the ability to take credit/debit card payment by next January, if not sooner. I am already talking to our rep at First National Bank of Pasco about setting this up, costs, equipment and process.

Please be aware that the Association takes your e-mail security seriously. When you give us your email address, the association keeps that address secure in our database, and it is only permitted to be used for official Association business by current members of the Board of Directors, and should come from their email address. The list of Board of Directors and their emails will be at the end of every News/Newsletter from now on just before the frequently called numbers. The emails are loaded also loaded into a secure email server account at MailChimp.com which services the Associations official email needs. All official Association announcements go out from the Association email account oaksroyal3@gmail.com via MailChimp. This system does not send group email, rather it send all the emails in the group as individual emails, just very, very quickly. This way your email servers (gmail, aol, yahoo, outlook, hotmail, etc.) will not identify them as a spam group email and block it. The main reason for not receiving association emails, or for stopping to receive Association emails, has been users "unsubscribing", this is easy to do as it is federally mandated on email systems now. If this happens just let me know and I can email you a link, you can click on it and follow simple instructions to get back in. If you have any concerns about these please do not hesitate to contact me.
