

# **Officer and Director Reports**

### Ann Parks, President

It is so nice to see everyone who has been able to get their homes re-built after Hurricane Milton, or at least to get a start on getting things back to where they were before the storm. This was such a devastating hit to our community adhere at Oaks Royal 3 and to our larger community in Zephyrhills, Pasco County and Florida!

The Board arranged for John Mobley to come and take down those badly damaged trees and remove the downed tree from the Zephyr Creek, as announced after Hurricane Milton. Along with the trash removal these were accomplished with non-budgetary funds from the Frontier account.

As reported at the members meeting we have sent letters with photos concerning the bad erosion in our portion of Zephyr Creek to the Governor, the water management district, County Commissioners and others. We continue to explore options as to what Pasco County is planning on revising watershed areas after the two storms, or what we as an HOA might be allowed to do to mitigate this damage and agencies or ways of paying for it.

We as a board are aware of several homes that have become vacant. We are in the process of notifying home owners or families members to improve exterior condition.

Thank you the Women's Group for an awesome Board dinner. We do have good cooks in OR3.

I want to thank everyone who participated in this year's election: the residents who ran for office, the residents on the Nomination/Election Committee who helped make the election run smoothly, and of course the residents who voted either in person or by absentee ballot. Thank you the members of the Nomination/Election Committee who all elected to serve again in 2025: Lee Bruggeman, Joyce Engelhardt, Kathy Hatt, Deborah Overholt, Caroly Pardy, Deborah Weadick and Joyce Zikeli.

The three HOA Board positions up for election in January 2026 are: President, Clubhouse Director and Hospitality Director. If you are interested in running for one of these positions, please review the board member position description on the website About page at https://oaksroyal3.com/About or talk to the incumbent in the position. Then let me know in writing (letter or email) that you are nominating yourself for the position.

On another note, as announced at the January members meeting, letters will be going out shortly to residents about any exterior maintenance issues on their property that need to be addressed. The letter has a checklist which references the declaration or bylaws sections containing language relevant to the issues. Only the checked items need to be addressed by the residents in the 21 day period indicated. The Board wanted to wait until now to start this process to give returning residents a chance to address their property condition, and of course any unusual storm related issues. This is an essential board function, we aren't trying to be nosy or interfering, we are trying to keep the entire park looking well maintained and well .. looking good! If properties and homes are well maintained they will not only last a long time, they will give home owners fewer problems, they will hold up better in the summer storms (including the tropical sort), and it keeps the park looking presentable to visitors and potential buyers as well, which in turn helps keep to keep our property values. Just some examples: cracked and broken lattice or screening will fly apart faster in high winds and make your homes more vulnerable, that algae turning your siding green or roofs rust colored can eat into and weaken those surfaces with time, clean concrete drives and sidewalks are safer walking surfaces. Thank you everyone ahead of time for working with us.

### Treasurer, Guy Engelhardt

Thank you to all who have sent in their 2025 HOA Annual Dues, either if full or a first payment in a semiannual, quarterly our monthly payment plan. To date, out of 147 homes, I only a missing payments from about 12 residents who hopefully have sent their payments and I have just not received it yet. Those who did send any payment by January 31st, will be reported to the Board as over 30 days past due at the next Board meeting, February 2nd. They will be receiving registered letters giving them 14 days to send a payment or eighteen percent (18%) simple interest will be added to their dues per Declaration Article V, section 8. All other residents have done their part to keep the Association operating this year, again thank you, and all residents have been given many notices either hand delivered or mailed hard copy, or via emails.

The other new feature is on the main page of the website under "Online Payments", about halfway down the page. There is a new secured section where you will be able to make you annual dues payment by credit card if you so choose. This is possible as we have had to upgrade our website to a secure (https) server, the web server GoDaddy uses the same encryption used by banks and businesses to secure your web-based transactions. There is a button below to go directly to the secure online bill pay page.

With the state required changes to the website, the financial reports, board and member meeting minutes, and most other association documents are now filed each month in the new secured MEMBERS ONLY section of the website. If you want to access this area you need to request access. Simply go to our website at https://www.oaksroyal3.com or click on the button below and click on the HOA Member Only link at the top of the page (in may be under More in your browser) and then choose "Create Account". After you complete that information, I will approve your request and you will receive a link to create your password and get access.

## **Florida Festivals**

February 2025 festivals in Florida

#### Artfest Fort Myers, Fort Myers, Feb. 1-2, 2025

The free festival takes place on the waterfront in historic downtown Fort Myers and features a juried exhibition of 290 fine artists from all over the country. Along with the art, the festival features interactive art exhibits, children's activities, live music, and demonstrations.

#### Mount Dora Arts Festival, Mount Dora, Feb. 1-2, 2025.

Charming Mount Dora is a city of festivals, and this free fest attracts 250,000 for top art, food and entertainment. From Florida Rambler: **Things to do in Mount Dora**.

#### South Florida Garlic Fest, Wellington, Feb. 1-2, 2025

A big event with food and top musical performers, it started as a fundraiser for several non-profits. The festival outgrew Delray Beach and moved to Wellington Green.

#### Everglades Seafood Festival, Everglades City, February 7-9, 2025

This event in Florida's Stone Crab Capitol packs 'em in for fresh seafood, country music, carnival rides, crafts booths. An estimated 50,000 people attend each year in

this small town (population 500) for the three-day event. This year, the festival, which has been free for many years, is asking for a minimum \$10 donation.

#### Florida State Fair, Tampa, Feb. 6-17, 2025

It boasts the largest midway in the USA, but its core purpose, celebrated for more than 100 years, is to showcase Florida agriculture and its history. Florida Rambler story on Florida State Fair

#### Scottish Highland Festival, Mount Dora, Feb. 14-16, 2025

This gated event features Scottish bands and musicians all the weekend at Donnelly Park and an afternoon of Highland Games in Gilbert Park on Saturday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.

#### The Battle of Olustee Civil War Re-Enactment, Sanderson, Feb. 14-16, 2025

Florida's largest Civil War battle is re-enacted, with gun smoke, booming cannons and cavalry.

#### Cortez Commercial Fishing Festival, Cortez, Feb. 15-16, 2025

Cortez started as a fishing village, and it still has a working waterfront and fishing boats. The festival offers music, nautical arts and crafts, children's activities, environmental exhibits and lots of fresh seafood. From Florida Rambler: Visiting Cortez

#### Fiddler Crab Festival, Steinhatchee, Feb. 14-16, 2025

The tiny remote Gulf-front town of Steinhatchee was walloped by Hurricane Idalia in 2023 and had extensive flooding with Hurricane Debby in 2024. It's bouncing back, but needs folks to spend the night and eat and drink at local establishments. The festival offers music, food and craft vendors.

#### Coconut Grove Arts Festival, Miami, Feb 15-17, 2025

A huge fair (covering many blocks with 350+ exhibitors) and a beautiful waterfront setting make this one of the most popular art festivals in Florida. As a result, it attracts top entertainers, food vendors and artists. Held annually on Presidents Day Weekend

#### ArtiGras Fine Arts Festival, Jupiter, Feb. 15-16, 2025

A top juried festival with 300 artists, Artigras is celebrating 39 years of family fun this year. This is a ticketed event (\$11) that raises money for local charities. From Florida Rambler: **Things to do in Jupiter** 

#### Sanford Porchfest, Sanford, Feb. 22, 2025

Lively music-filled Sanford has a one day free music festival described this way: "17 porches; over 70 bands." This town fills its beautiful oak-shaded historic district with free concerts you attend by strolling from block to block all afternoon. From Florida Rambler: **Things to do in Sanford**.

#### South Beach Wine and Food Festival, Feb. 20–23, 2025

This four-day event in its third decade showcases the talents of renowned wine and spirits producers, chefs and culinary personalities. Proceeds benefit the Chaplin

School of Hospitality & Tourism Management at Florida International University.

#### Naples National Art Festival, Naples, Feb. 21-23, 2025

Ranked among the top art festivals in the state, the event takes place in scenic Cambier Park and along 8th Street South in downtown Naples. It features 194 artists who complete for inclusion and the fair does not admit mass-produced items. From Florida Rambler: Things to do in Naples

#### Swamp Cabbage Festival, La Belle, Feb. 22-23, 2025
