In an era where soft skills are as crucial as technical knowledge, the LifOpps Communicating with Confidence Learning Labs are revolutionizing how students develop leadership abilities from 4th grade through high school. This student-led program uniquely merges STEAM education with essential communication skills, creating a dynamic laboratory where young minds flourish. "We're not just teaching public speaking," explains Program Facilitator William Freeman.

"We're cultivating future leaders who can articulate complex ideas, collaborate effectively, and think critically."Through mock business scenarios and hands-on projects, students transform from hesitant speakers into confident communicators. The program's success aligns with the National Science Teachers Association's emphasis on active, real-world learning experiences. Students have opportunities to actively learn, teach others, gain selfknowledge and retain more information.

Young Entrepreneurs Take Root at Golden Elementary



The program, targeting grades 4-6, transforms traditional after-school hours into dynamic entrepreneurship workshops.

Over ten sessions, students dive into real-world financial literacy – from product ideation to budget management. The highlight? A Mini Market Product Launch Showcase where young innovators present their business ventures to families.

"We're not just teaching finance; we're cultivating future leaders," says Gisele Nguyen, the REACH Foundation's President. "When you see a fifth-grader confidently explaining their profit margins, you know you're witnessing something special."

This financial literacy program promises to revolutionize how children understand money and business.
