## "Helping Hand" Scholarship

The "Helping Hand" Scholarship from Scholarships360 gives future college students from low-income households the chance to win \$1,000! This includes high school seniors, as well as current college and graduate students. Applicants must write a 250 word essay telling their story as a low-income student, and how the scholarship would help their educational journey. Both the essay quality and interaction on Scholarships360 of each application are considered. The application is due on February 28, 2026, and can be found through the [Scholarships360](#) platform.

## "Making Waves" Scholarship for Women

The \$1,000 "Making Waves" Essay Scholarship supports high school, undergraduate, and graduate student women who are pursuing their dream, no matter how big or how small. Open to female U.S. citizens and permanent residents, the scholarship prompts applicants to write an essay about an inspirational female figure in their lives. Applications are evaluated on both essay quality and the applicant's overall engagement on the Scholarships360 platform. The application closes on March 31, 2026. Get a headstart and apply now!
