Our REACH team is beyond excited for this upcoming year and invites you to keep up with us as we go along with this journey!



## STEAM Club's Hydrogen Home Tour


REACH, in partnership with SoCalGas, hosted an innovative learning experience through the Hydrogen Innovation Experience (H2IE), the first project of its kind in the nation. Interns and Ambassadors explored the future of clean energy by learning directly from experts about hydrogen, energy grids, and renewable applications. Students participated in hands-on activities, including assembling a solar hydrogen experimentation system, generating hydrogen with solar panels, and observing how electrolyzers and fuel cells operate. The visit also featured a tour of SoCalGas's H2 Smart Grid, capable of powering one hundred homes, and concluded with a look inside a hydrogen-blended home. The experience was made possible through the hospitality and expertise of Ms. Clarissa Serpas, Mr. Joe Leiva, and Ms. Alicia, whose support enriched the day. # COMMUINICATING WITH CONFIDENCE LEARNING LAB

The Communicating with Confidence Learning Labs is an engaging afterschool STEAM Club Program designed for 4th-6th grade students at Fairmont Elementary. Through interactive, hands-on activities, students step into the roles of innovators and leaders, strengthening their communication, collaboration, and critical thinking skills. Guided by the Engineering Design Process, participants create dynamic presentations and videos on topics that inspire them, building both confidence and creativity. Research shows that strong communication skills not only support higher academic achievement and resilience but also foster long-term success. The program begins September 9 and runs through October 9, meeting twice weekly for a total of 15 hours of empowering, skill-building experiences.



#### REACH's First LEGO League Kick Off

The Reach Foundation's Robotics Program proudly participates in the FIRST Lego League, an international competition that inspires students to think like scientists and engineers. Open to 1st-8th grade students, this program blends creativity, teamwork, and problem solving as students design, build, and program robots. Along the way, participants explore real world challenges and discover innovative solutions with hands-on learning. Adding onto this, students were able to further their love for discovery at the La Brea Tar Pits where students were able to explore fossiled sites, observe scientists in action, and learn how prehistoric animals were unearthed. With the chance to ask their own questions, particpants connected their own curiosity. with history and discovery

# Backpack of Hope School Supply Drive

On August 6, the REACH Foundation participated in Yorba Linda Police Services' National Night Out, an event dedicated to building community and promoting safety. The Pen to Paper Scholarship for Storytellers awards one \$1,000 scholarship to students who showcase their passion for creative writing through a 250-word original piece. Open to all grade levels --high school, undergraduate, and graduate students--who are U.S. citizens or permanent residents, the scholarship values poetry, short stories, novels, or screenplays as powerful forms of expression. Applications open July 1, 2025, close on October 31, 2025 (11:59 PM EST), and the winner will be announced November 30, 2025.
