Hi Teaching Tree Families,

The Teaching Tree illness policy states:

Children must be excluded from care for the following reasons:

- 1. The child is not able to participate in usual activities. The child may be very tired, irritable, or inconsolable.
- 2. The child needs more individual care than the program can provide.
- 3. The illness or symptoms are on the exclusion list below:

Chicken Pox – until blisters have dried and crusted

Pink Eye – until 24 hours after treatment

Coughing/Croup - medical attention is necessary

Diarrhea – uncontained or consecutive diarrhea within two hours

Fever – 100.4 or higher

Head Lice or Scabies - may return after treatment starts

Impetigo – until 24 hours after treatment starts

Body rash w/ fever – rash that spreads quickly, opening weeping wounds and/or is not healing

Ringworm – may return after treatment starts; keep area covered for first 48 hours of treatment

RSV - seek medical advice

Hand, Food & Mouth Disease – excessive drooling, not able to participate comfortably, fever, any types of sores in mouth, open/oozing sores

Strep throat – until 24 hours after treatment and the child is able to participate

Vomiting – until vomiting resolves for 24 hours

COVID – symptom free for 24 hours

If Teaching Tree is experiencing an outbreak of any a specific illness, the Health Department may recommend adjusting the exclusionary rules for a specific illness.

FAQ:

Q: What warrants a Teaching Tree staff member to check my child's temperature?

A: Teaching Tree staff have thermometers on-site and will check a child's temperature if they don't seem to be feeling well (lethargy, cough, etc.) Teaching Tree uses a digital ear thermometer to check student temperatures and the child's temperature is always checked in both ears.

Q: I had to pick my child up because they had a fever. When I got home, I checked it, and my child did not have a fever at the time. Can they return before the 24-hour mark?

A: Unfortunately, not. In order to keep consistency among students, we have to stick with the 24- hour exclusion policy based on the child's temperature when they were at Teaching Tree.

Q: My child has a fever, but they are teething and I suspect that is why they have a fever. Can they remain in care?

A: Unfortunately, not. We know it can be tricky for kiddos who are teething as sometimes it does cause a low-grade fever, but regardless of the reason for the fever, they do have to be excluded from care until they are fever-free (without the use of medication) for at least 24 hours.

Q: My child has a fever, but they just received vaccinations and I suspect that is why they have a fever. Can they remain in care?

A: Unfortunately, not. We know it can be tricky as sometimes kiddos get a fever after receiving vaccinations, but regardless of the reason for the fever, they do have to be excluded from care until they are fever-free (without the use of medication) for at least 24 hours.

Q: My child has an ear infection and will need antibiotics administered while in care at Teaching Tree. Is that possible?

A: Yes, we are able to administer medications onsite. The medication permission form must be filled out by a physician, signed by the parents, and approved by our nurse before we can administer the medication. We cannot administer "as needed" medications (for example: we cannot keep medications on-hand for teething, etc.)

Q: Does Teaching Tree have a nurse onsite?

A: We do not have a nurse onsite, but do work with a nurse consultant who meets with us in-person on a monthly basis. She is also available to Teaching Tree admin by phone or email when necessary.

The health and wellness of children and staff is a top priority at Teaching Tree. We are mandated by state Health Department regulations and want do to what we can to keep our students healthy on a daily basis.
