Andrew Hammon is well known trombonist and recording artist who has played with the RAAF band and is one of the cofounders of the Hammon/Rankin project.

The Hammon/Rankin Project is a Melbourne-based quintet playing contemporary, Australian jazz written and arranged by Andrew Hammon (trombone) and Louisa Rankin (voice). The music of H/RP strives to emulate the small ensemble writing of Wayne Shorter's classic 60's Blue Note albums and the compositions of the Dave Holland Quintet while probably sounding nothing like either.



Aiden Purdy is a freelance tuba, trombone, and electric bass player from Rochester, Victoria. He started playing tuba at the age of 9 and has since gone on to win around 50 state titles across Victoria on various instruments, and 5 national titles on tuba. Aidan has spent the last few years touring Australia, America, Canada, New Zealand, and Europe with groups such as Los King Fu Monkeys from Tijuana Mexico, The Resignators from Korweinguboora Australia, The Australian Tuba Quartet, and more. Aside from all of this, Aidan has spent many years playing with a number of world music ensembles around Australia and has found Baltic Bar Mitzvah his favourite platform for delivering the Balkan flavoured electro-tuba funk.
