Depart: Wednesday 18th September 11:55 pm from Melbourne Airport **Return:** Wednesday 25th September 10:40 pm to Melbourne Airport



We will be staying at the YMCA in the heart of Auckland, only a few minutes walk from the CBD.


We have booked a range of comfortable rooms including:
