1. Introductions were made.

2. Minutes from January 2020 BPC Meeting were approved.

3. Administrative Reports

- a. Ms. Kelly King
 - Kindergarten enrollment is now live on school website. Previous issues with the link have been fixed.
 (1) Friday, March 6th is the on-site Kindergarten registration day
 - ii. District 95 will be getting a new website soon. They are in the process of choosing a vendor. No official rollout date just yet. Hoping for summer 2020.
 - iii. Spring club sign-up is now live. There were some concerns about lack of clubs for K and 1st grade. One additional club added for K-1. This is the first year K has been included in clubs. Expect options to grow over time.
- b. Mr. Mike Sorensen
 - i. Bus tracking app is now working. There was an issue where the student's bus stop was defaulting to the closest stop instead of actual stop. This has been fixed.
 - ii. Sound system for the stage has been purchased. Cost was less than expected so P.O. was sent today.
 - iii. The school has decided on a fun new way to use the over-sized Connect 4 game purchased by the BPC. Students are being challenged to exit the lunchroom quietly. Daily points are awarded to the classroom with the quietest and most orderly lunch room exit. At the end of the week, classroom with the most points will get the Connect 4 in their classroom!
 - iv. Brook Park School has been approved for a garden grant. Still many unknowns but it will focus on educating students about growing vegetables, cooking vegetables, etc. A spring club was developed related to this in order to gauge interest. Garden will be in the school courtyard.
