# **Cisco Hit by Cyberattack**

A Cyberattack hit Cisco back on May 24th and they have recently released details regarding the attack. The hacker group Lapsus\$ is said to be responsible after it released a list of files onto the dark web gained from the attack using a Yanluowang ransomware. Cisco claims none of the files contain sensitive data.



## What is Yanluowang Ransomware?

Powershell is used to download tools onto compromised systems, this allows them to undergo a more in depth reconnaissance of the system. Hackers then gain access usually with ConnectWise which allows them to use tools to gain credentials, such as: GrabFF, GrabChrome and BrowserPassView.
