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Android phones are vulnerable to fingerprint brute-force attacks

Researchers at Tencent Labs and Zhejiang University have presented a new attack called 'BrutePrint', which brute-forces fingerprints on smartphones to bypass user authentication and take control. They exploit two zero-day vulnerabilities and biometric data on the fingerprint sensors' SPI, allowing for a man-in-the-middle (MITM) attack.
