

DLGE CHRISTINE MANAGES \$316K HURRICANE DORIAN FUNDING

In 2019, more than seventy-thousand people in The Bahamas lost nearly everything, because of the Category 5 monstrous hurricane, Dorian. Among the affected were close to 100 Kiwanians and their families living on the Islands of Abaco and Grand Bahama.

The Kiwanis Foundation of Canada committed \$100,000.00 and set out on a campaign to raise additional funds for the cause. Through this humble act, over \$216,000 was raised from other Kiwanis Districts, Clubs, Kiwanians, and Friends of the impacted.

DLGE Christine is humbled to have been selected to chair the committee for the distribution of these funds. She describes it as a humbling experience, having realized what an awesome network of caring people we are as members of the Kiwanis organization. This act of kindness by the KFC will never be forgotten by the residents of Abaco and Grand Bahama. DLGE Christine's empathy, integrity, and team management skills proved exceptional, resulting in her receiving The Mel Osborne Fellowship medal.

After nearly 20 years of consistent service to the family, in 2021 tragedy returned, when the mom of the boys died. Her last words were for Christine to continue to look out for her boys. And that she did. Today, many years later, Christine remains faithful to these young men, with the help of other Kiwanians, family, and friends.

Many of the acts of kindness of this servant leader are like this. Consistently, she lends a helping hand while opening her heart, to bring hope to those in need. Christine says, "For me, what matters most is the joy of knowing that I have made a difference, especially when it is manifested in the lives of children, whom you watch grow up to become purposeful young people- leading productive lives."

The boys have all graduated and are gainfully employed alongside DLGE Christine in different departments at The Paint Place, Nassau, The Bahamas, raising their own children and making positive contributions to society. Christine says, "This is my why."





Christine King was born on March 15 in Nassau, The Bahamas. The child of teenage parents, she had to be cared for by grandparents and her aunt, Queenie. She was taken from the city to rural Cat Island, where she spent her formative years. Life was not always easy, rather interesting and most of the time fun but perplexing.

The story of Tragedy, Triumph and Service sums up DLGE Christine's life. Both of her parents were deceased by the time she was nineteen, leaving her to raise her siblings - three teenage girls.

"Tough times never last, tough people do". Christine says, this quote by Robert Schuller resonated with her and her sisters and they made every effort to make truth out of it. As the years went on and as each sister graduated and began to

work, they grew closer. They each worked and attended college part-time. Eventually each successfully graduated.

"People often applaud us for doing well, but I am so much more delighted when they recognize and applaud us for sticking together", DLGE Christine recounts. "My greatest achievements yet, are my sisters and their kids.





Christine and Gary found each other immersed in a life of service. As Kiwanians, they had seen one another at District Kiwanis events and when their connection grew from acquaintances to friends to partners, it simply seemed like the ideal fit.

They first met around 2011 in Collingwood, Canada, with the Blue Mountains as a backdrop. However, it was on Prince Edward Island, in Canada, at another district Kiwanis convention, in 2014, that they had the kind of interaction that left them each wanting a deeper connection.

Christine says of Gary, "I always wanted someone who was service-oriented. I don't think it could have gotten any closer than what I wanted. She particularly appreciates his honesty. "He's real, and he's really loving and helpful. We gel well together



These two have found each other in the annals of service to humanity. Their union comprises of a DLG and a DLGE as both have served as Distinguished Lieutenant Governors in Kiwanis.

Gary says ironically, he joined Kiwanis to serve other people and by meeting Christine, ended up helping himself. "It's not only helping the less fortunate – it's helping us too."
