Poultry Farms of St George

In the 1932 Chronicles of St George there is a Business Directory for each village. In the village of St George, also known by some as Wiley's Corner, the poultry farms mentioned belonged to Earl Kinney, Maynard Kinney, Joseph Robinson, and Winslow Robinson. The business directory for Tenants Harbor listed five people under the category of Milk, Poultry and Eggs – nothing that was strictly poultry. The other villages in town did not have any mention of poultry.

Some of the buildings and foundations of this industry can still be seen along the River Road north of the Rt 73 intersection. They can be seen behind the Andrew Robinson House where Winslow Robinson lived in 1932. Other buildings can be seen at what was known as the Sunshine Poultry Farms – operated by Maynard Kinney – who can be seen in the picture in the upper left.


Membership Dues

St George Band

From a Courier-Gazette article of 21 Jun 1892 – “*The St George Band is made up as follows; Fred Smalley, e flat cornet; C S Watts, solo b flat cornet and leader; W Robinson, 1st b flat cornet; Archie Smalley, 2nd b flat cornet; Fred Gilchrest, solo e flat alto ; J A Gilchrest, 2nd e flat alto ; Shepherd Smalley, 3d e flat alto; G H Kerswell, 1st b flat tenor; E Sherman, 2nd b flat tenor; Bert Pierson, baritone; Sidney G Robinson, b flat bass; D A Hathorn, e flat bass; J T Robinson, tenor drum; Benjamin Fuller, bass drum; Hollis Gilchrest, cymbals. The band is busily preparing for the coming season's work and is making good advancement.*”

From a Courier-Gazette article of 13 Jun 1893 – “*The St. George Band is now in readiness to furnish music for all occasions. Having received new uniforms and having a good set of instruments the band is fully equipped for summer business in the line of military music. C S Watts is leader.*”

From a Courier-Gazette article of 23 Nov 1907 – “*The Wiley's Corner Band. This band although a comparatively new one is composed of young men who are making their first venture in band work, while several of the members, who were formerly in the old St. George Band, are retained in their same positions in the new organization. The Wiley's Corner Band was organized Oct. 1 and is having two rehearsals a week under the direction of Fred Smalley. The list of members and the instrumentation are as follows: W L Robinson, bass; John Burns, baritone; Donald Burns, Orris Kinney, H Kalloch, trombones; J Robinson, A Johnson, Earl Kinney, altos; E Smalley (leader), E Robinson, H L Ewell, Alfred Hocking, cornets; Fred Smalley (director), S W Fuller, clarinets; J W Thomas, snare drum; B Fuller, bass drum; Wilford Robinson, cymbals.*”

The date of the above picture is not known but is probably in the era of the early 1890s to the mid-1900s, and it is identified on the back as the St George Band at the Trotting Park in Thomaston.

Early Wiley's Corner School

This picture was found in a scrapbook dated 1941 that was given to Capt Frank O Hilt by his wife, Dora, and their son Willard. The description on the page says “Old School House Built in 1827 – Picture of school was taken in front of the old schoolhouse on the hill where the present school building now stands. The old building was bought by Mr J A Ewell and moved to his place of business, it is used by the J A Ewell Co at the present time as a store.” The scrapbook page also states that the teacher at the time the picture was taken was Fred Witham.

As seen by the numbers on the kids, the students were identified by Dora (Robinson) Hilt, who is #4 in the picture. Below is the list of identified children:

The back of this picture says "Home of C H Kalloch, St George, Maine, in 1906. Sold in 1937 to Winslow Robinson". Deeds also refer to it as the homestead of Edward Watts (1817-1899), a local sea captain. It is across from the Andrew Robinson House – known as 950 River Road. Capt Frank Hilt and his new wife, Dora, were living here in the 1910 census.
