In reviewing our collection and entering items into our database, we came across a portrait with the name George S Bond across the bottom. It is the large, framed portrait in the above photo. We didn't know where it came from, so we started to dig to find who he was. There was a George Seavey Bond who was born in St George in 1875, but the portrait is earlier than that. Then we found a George S Bond who was from Jefferson, Maine, and was in the Civil War. Long story short, the Jefferson Historical Society was contacted, confirmed who he was, and they came and got him.

The photo above was provided by the Jefferson Historical Society and shows on the bottom, just below the portrait - a photo of George being picked up in St George to go home, and the photo to the left of the portrait is a photo of George with his brothers Abial and William.

This is just one example of historical societies working together to share what they have, and to get items to their rightful home. Glad you got home okay, George!!
