In case of bad weather, this program will be moved to another time, and that notice will be posted on our Facebook page, on our website, and people on our email list will also receive a notification.




#### **Cemetery Preservation Fund**

This is a picture of Mary (Teel) Wilson, who was born in 1781 and died in 1867. On the back of this picture it says "this is her house", and that supports information that the house was first occupied by her and her husband, William Wilson, who died the same day as Mary in 1867.



On opening day in May, the Old Library Museum was visited by Melissa & Mike Maglio. Melissa is related to the Harts & Hathorns of St George and was looking for information about her relatives. Her great-grandmother was Lydia Hart, wife of sea captain Orris Hathorn.


Lydia's sister was Susie, wife of sea captain Charles B Brown. The Brown house is still in the family and a few years ago Jane Brown allowed us to scan some of the old photos in the house, most of which did not have names on them.

Long story short, with Mike Maglio's help, the photo to the left from the Brown collection is believed to be of Lydia and Susie's parents – Eunice Clark and Jesse Hart! Jesse Hart (1811-1868) was a sea captain, and he and his wife Eunice (1814-1874) were the parents of eight children.
