

Fort Point State Park

The History

From Albert Smalley's "History of St George" we learn that "the most substantial relic of the War of 1812 left in St. George is the old fort at Wiley's Corner, which is now a State Park."." It was built in 1809 by Thomas Vose of Thomaston. It consisted of a rampart in the form of a crescent, facing the river. Supposedly it was equipped with three 18 pound cannon. There were barracks and a small blockhouse and powder magazine built of brick." "The old fort had only one engagement. In 1814 H.M.S. Bulwark, a ship of 74 guns sailed up the river. At the fort they were opposed by only one man, Ephraim Wiley, veteran of Valley Forge." "Eph was sorely outnumbered by his Majesty's forces, so for the first time in his life he surrendered." After he told them to scram, they "spiked his guns and departed." "Aside from the remains of the fort, the only known relics are the key to the powder house, a musket owned by Bernard Rackliff and in a sense, the flintlock rifle owned and used in the Revolution and war of 1812 by Joseph Robinson. This musket is in the Knox Memorial at Thomaston. "

It was in the fall of 1808 that Joseph Robinson sold this piece of land known as Robinson's Point to the US government "for the purpose of erecting a fort on St George's River." At this time the point was used as a ferry landing between Cushing and St George. In 1923 the US government transferred ownership of "all of the land known as Fort Saint Georges" to the State of Maine "for public park purposes only".



Plans for the Future



Our Conservation Commission was instrumental in building the Fort Point Trail from the parking area near Rt 131 down across town property to the State Park – the only public access to the St George River. The State Park is a special place with views up and down the river.

Due to very high use and erosion, the Fort Point Trail has deteriorated and had to be closed several times over the last few years. In reviewing some possible repairs to the trail it was determined that the trail could be improved to provide Universal Access (UA). A UA trail provides access for people with limited mobility, such as people with walkers, wheelchairs and families with strollers.

The Select Board recently formed an ad hoc committee to work with the State and develop plans for better access to and around the State Park. State officials were pleased with the idea of a UA trail and seemed willing to provide full funding for the construction of a UA trail. However, funding is needed within the next few months for the costs associated with design and planning. Request from Poland



EDWIN BISSELL HOLT

Last week we received an email from a faculty member – Dr Jacek Jarocki - at John Paul II Catholic University in Lublin, Poland, asking about a resident of Tenants Harbor back in the 1930s – 1940s. He was asking about Edwin B Holt.

Edwin B Holt was a professor of philosophy and psychology at Harvard University from 1901 to 1918. From 1926 to 1936 he was a visiting professor of psychology at Princeton University, retiring to Tenants Harbor in 1936, buying a place on the St George River, now known as 320 Wallston Road. Holt died in Rockland in 1946 and left the property on the river to his longtime companion, George X Bernier.

Dr Jarocki said that he is currently writing a biographical paper on Edwin Holt as well as a book on the New Realists, a philosophy from the early 20th century. Jarocki says that very little is known about Holt's time in Maine and he is hoping to make contact with someone who could shed some light on Holt and Bernier.
