

Our French 22nd Infantry Society President and Vice President: **Loic Parent** and **Julien Woestyn.** We are planning a visit to Normandy, France the first week of August 2023 (for a week or so) and our European Brethren will take us through the battlefields we fought from Utah Beach where the 22nd Infantry Regiment landed to the Beachhead Breakout. The tour will last from 3-5 August. I have If you are interested in joining the party send me an email or give me a call! I'd like to have 2 more couples join us, I can



pick you up 0800 on 03 August at 0900 in Frankfurt, DE as it's a 9-hour drive to Normandy. Our French 22<sup>nd</sup> Infantry Society will be presenting a commemorative plaque at the Cherbourg Airport in tribute to the 22<sup>nd</sup> Infantry Regiment. Here's a note from Loic, our 22nd Infantry France President: "With Julien we have started to prepare 2023. We said that ideally for you will be to arrive on Thursday, August 3, 2023, on the Normandy at your accommodation (I'm staying at the Chateau de Flottemanville). On August 3,4 and 5 you will be with us where we will present the liberation of the Val de Saire (region in the northeast of the department of the sleeve) up to the capture and liberation of Cherbourg airport and the inauguration of a plaque in homage to the 22nd (still used today by the US Army during the festivities of June 6). Of course, a trip to Utah will be planned for a rose deposit where vou will be presented with the typical outfit used during June 6 but also the battery of Crisbecq where we have already established a commemorative plaque on the site. Here is a preview. When we will have confirmation of your coming, we will make a group on Facebook to show you the evolution and the preparation of the stay."

22<sup>nd</sup> Infantry Regiment, France, made the first presentation of the Regiment Colors at the grave site of **Issac Curtis Phillips**. Dog Company, 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion, 22<sup>nd</sup> Infantry Regiment, WW II. Issac Curt



is Phillips, simply known as Curtis to his friends, was the Veteran who inspired Loic and Julien to not only seek out the history of the 22<sup>nd</sup> Infantry Regiment during its trek from the D Day landing on Utah Beach across France and Belgium but to form the re-



enactment group that honors all the brave Americans who fought and died in service with the Regiment during WW II.

Loic made a promise to Curtis' widow [Arlette]they would honor the memory of Curtis and is keeping the promise.

William Louis
Kenyon was born in
Binghampton,
Broome County, New
York on January 7,
1912, the son of
William and Florence
Kenyon. By 1940 he
was married to his
wife Mary and
working at the
Endicott Johnson
Shoe Company
factory in Johnson
City, New York.



Kenyon was drafted into the Army on February 27, 1941, at Albany, New York. At the time of induction, he had completed one year of college, and listed his civilian occupation as Semi-skilled occupations in manufacture of boots and shoes. He stood six feet tall, had blue eyes, brown hair, and weighed 195 pounds.

Kenyon landed on Utah Beach on D-Day June 6, 1944, as the 1st Sergeant of Company G 2nd Battalion 22nd Infantry 4th Infantry Division. He took part with his Company in the battle for Cherbourg and then in the hedgerow fighting of Normandy.

For Operation Cobra he and his Regiment were temporarily attached to Combat Command A under **Brigadier General Maurice Rose**, to help spearhead the breakout from Normandy. During the Operation Kenyon's Battalion rode on tanks of 2nd Battalion 66th Armored Regiment 2nd Armored Division, from July 25 – August 2, 1944. When they met opposition, Kenyon and his Company would dismount the tanks and fight on foot.

On August 1, Company G met stiff German resistance in a series of hedgerows, and several men lay wounded and exposed on the battlefield, including the Company Commander, 1st Lieutenant Lawson Magruder. Kenyon was awarded the Silver Star for his actions that day. His citation read in part:

"The rifle company of which Sergeant Kenyon was first sergeant, with its company commander seriously wounded in a mortar barrage and all of its platoon leaders either seriously wounded or killed in action, had dropped back two hedgerows in disorderly manner. Voluntarily assuming command, Sergeant Kenyon, at great personal risk, speedily whipped his remaining men into an effective unit as an enemy counterattack was developing. Knowing that a number of his wounded men still lay in front of his lines, Sergeant Kenyon moved forward approximately 150 yards, in the face of withering enemy fire, and evacuated four wounded men to places of comparative safety. The courage and initiative displayed by Sergeant Kenyon reflect great credit upon himself and the armed forces of the United States."

Kenyon saved the life of his Company Commander that day, carrying the seriously wounded Magruder from danger. The next day, August 2, 1944, Kenyon himself was wounded, and had to be evacuated to a medical facility for a period of recovery. He returned to duty with his Company on September 21, 1944.

Kenyon was wounded a second time, this time in the Hürtgen Forest in Germany, on December 2, 1944, when shrapnel cut into his left cheek. He was treated by a Combat Medic and remained with his Company. He was

wounded a third time, in Luxembourg during the Battle of the Bulge, on December 26, 1944. Again, he was hit by shrapnel to the face, and again he remained with his Company instead of being evacuated.

In the battle for the city of Prüm, Germany, on February 8, 1945, his Battalion was attacking from the west of the city, when an enemy counterattack by tanks and Infantry near Obermehlen stopped the advance, causing numerous casualties among the Americans. Kenyon was one of five enlisted men in Company G killed during the fight that day.

1st Sergeant William L. Kenyon was buried in the temporary American Military Cemetery, Foy Cemetery, at Bastogne, Belgium. In the 1947-1949 timeframe, when the temporary cemeteries were shut down, he was moved to his final resting place in Block G Row 8 Grave 55 in Henri-Chapelle American Cemetery and Memorial, Henri-Chapelle, Arrondissement de Verviers, Liège, Belgium.

In 1990, the Commander of 2nd Battalion 22nd Infantry at Fort Drum, New York secured permission to officially name several buildings in his Battalion area after notables from the Battalion's history.

The Headquarters Building for 2nd Battalion 22nd Infantry was named and dedicated as Kenyon Hall, in honor of 1st Sergeant William L. Kenyon.

The illustration shows the dedication ceremony of Kenyon Hall at Fort Drum in July 1990. At the podium is retired Colonel Lawson Magruder, the Company Commander



whose life was saved by 1st Sergeant Kenyon during his Silver Star action of August 1, 1944.

It is because of his appreciation for history, and the pride in his unit taken by LTC Sherwood, that the buildings at Fort Drum were named after 2nd Battalion 22nd Infantry soldiers. He successfully convinced the Army leadership it was a proper thing to do. LTC Sherwood said:

"For me, a regiment is like a family with a past as well as a present. We don't choose our families, nor do we choose our regiment, but once part of it, its history becomes one's own history, its former members become one's military ancestors."

#### Friday Reunion Tour Update

Here are the latest proposed details for the Reunion Friday 5/19 tours. Remember we will have bus transportation and the tour bus transportation is FREE! Plan on joining us after breakfast as we travel out to Ft Benning's 198th Infantry Training Brigade who will serve as host to us for a visit. **NOTE: We want to leave hotel NLT 0830hrs** 

The 198th Infantry Training Brigade motto "WE BUILD THE INFANTRY" explains their current mission to train and prepare new Army soldiers to become the Infantrymen of the future to assume the combat mission out on "Freedom's Doorstep."

Scheduled at this time is a morning visit with 197<sup>th</sup> IN BDE's Bravo Company 2-47<sup>th</sup> Infantry who will be at Eagle Tower Sand Hill. An EST (Engagement Skills Trainer) will be on site to treat us to a handicap friendly event that involves observing training and participating in a hands-on experience for all. (NOTE: Bob Babcock reminds us that the 47th Infantry was assigned to 4th ID in WWI)

After our morning with the heroes of the 197th, we will bus out to the National Infantry Museum for an "on your own lunch" at either the snack bar (first floor) or NIM's Fife & Drum Restaurant (second floor.), followed by "self-guided" tours of the museum and grounds.

Our schedule at NIM ensures everyone will have plenty of time to tour exhibits inside the museum and of course highlights of the outside displays tied to the 22nd Infantry Regiment. Those outside displays include Heritage Walkway Section 22A where over 125 pavers are dedicated solely to heroes of the 22nd Infantry Regiment. Also of interest is the "Sacred Ground" on Inouye Parade Field, where soil from every major US war is on display. You can visit the WALK OF HONOR where our 22nd Infantry Regiment Memorial Monument sits.

There are at least 30 other monuments (to include 4ID and 25ID) of other Army units along the walkway. We are hoping to have WWII Company Street available for inside viewing which is located just down from

Inouye Field. (NOTE: Thanks to **Karen Harrison** of NIM, who will have a couple of carts to travel up to monument area as needed)

Finally at end of the day (1700hrs) we gather at our Memorial Monument for an observance of the 20th year anniversary of deployments of 1/22 to Iraq and 2/22 to Afghan at Retreat Call. Former 22nd Infantry Battalion leadership, from that era, will be in front of the monument to deliver some brief comments. After that we will observe moments of silence as the honor and call the names of the fallen of the 22nd Infantry from Iraq and Afghanistan. Those names are listed on Panel Four of the monument.

Retreat will then conclude our visit.

After Retreat is observed we will have a few minutes for any last-minute photos before we board buses back to hotel.

Again, if you haven't already done it please indicate you will be joining us for the Friday tour(s) so we can get good head count for buses.

## Travel to and from 22<sup>nd</sup> Infantry Regiment Society Reunion at Columbus, GA, May 2023

Traveling to Columbus, GA is a costly and difficult undertaking. Flights are limited. My advice is to travel to the Atlanta, GA, Airport and then on to Columbus and the hotel via **Groome Transportation**.

Groome Transportation is a well-established company with schedules that will meet practically every need. Book your Groome travel by going to the Groome web site at groometransportation.com. Once you are at the site you will see BOOK A SHUTTLE. Click on that space. Then select Columbus, GA as your destination. Click on that and proceed to book your travel. Once you enter the date of your arrival you will see that

there are shuttles leaving every hour. You can book your return by going back to the site. And booking your return to the Atlanta Airport from the Columbus location. Groome has shuttles leaving Columbus starting at 2:30 AM and every hour thereafter. The cost of the one-way fare is \$47 per person when booked on-line. The cost is \$57 per person if you book at the pick-up point. And you may not be able to get on the shuttle if it is booked up. Be sure to leave plenty of time for your return to the Atlanta Airport. Travel time is 1 hour and 20 minutes. Again, plan on getting back to the Atlanta Airport well in advance of your flight departure time.

Here are some details on how to find the Groome Shuttle once you have arrived and picked up your baggage. You must go to the "Delta" or the "South" side of the airport and go through Gate S-6. Once outside, cross the walkway and look for the Ground Transportation signage and go to that site. Groome Shuttles are large vans that are well marked. The driver will have your name on a list of booked passengers. Your luggage will be placed in the van and all you have to do is sit back and enjoy the ride.

Getting from the Groome lot to the hotel will be taken care of by the hotel or Groome. The hotel's shuttle is under contract and may be taking pilots and crew either to or from the Columbus Airport. This only happens three times a day. The good people at Groome have told me that we need not worry because they will get us to the hotel and pick us up as becomes necessary. If there is a question about Groome bringing you to the hotel, your contact at Groome is **Mike Hansen**.

#### All,

First, I want to thank everyone for the continuing great newsletters being sent out to the membership. But in the most recent edition, I didn't see any recent searches for fellow Vets. I have been asking, online, for anyone who served with me in B Co, 2<sup>nd</sup> Platoon, from Feb 70-August 70, to contact me.

I was the E6 (transferred in from the 1st Div when they went home) Acting Platoon Leader for that period. But to my story. I was in Cu Chi on 21 days light duty, after being blown off the CO's APC after we hit a land mine. This took place about a month before the Cambodian Operation. During that time, (the story I got) one of the missions my platoon had assigned to them, was a sweep of the perimeter of the Cu Chi base camp. During that sweep, some of the guys dismounted the tracks. One of these guys stepped on a land mine and was immediately rushed into the Base Hospital ER. I, along with **Doc Richie Byers**, waited in the hospital to see this guy, after his long ordeal in the ER.

When we finally got to see him, he was pretty dopey from all the anesthetic and pain meds. In fact, at that point he didn't even realize he had lost both legs. Naturally, he was ultimately medevac'd to the States.

When I DEROSED out back home to the States, I was told by the Company Clerk that the latest they had on him was he has recovering well and would soon be fitted with his prosthetic legs. I could go on in greater detail, but my long-time wish, has been to find this guy and reunite with him, even if it is only by phone or email.

I have no recollection of his name at all. All I remember was he was new to the Platoon, and he was VERY young.
