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Authority: 1. The power to enforce laws, exact obedience, command, determine, or judge.

2. Power assigned to another; authorization

Spiritually speaking, I like the second definition the best. Even though as Christians, we do have the power to enforce and command mountains to move, we can only do it because that power has been assigned to us—and authorizing us is the One and Only Son of the living God Himself, Jesus Christ. It says in the Word of God, that He is the head and we are the body (Eph 1:22-23). As a body, we cannot do anything unless the head tells us to do it. If you don't believe me, try cutting your head off and then doing something with your body—The head is the one authorizing the body to do the works the He did.

I got up one morning, really earlier than I usually do, and I found myself wondering why I could pray for some things and they would seemingly "line-up" with God's Word, but for other things, I could not. "What?"

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"And why is that amiss?"

yourself. Don't ask me to heal you—Tell your infirmity to leave in My Name that is all the authority you need. Speak to that mountain—don't let it speak to you."

What an eye-opener! I had heard these things before—from my Pastor, Charlie Rogers. I had listened to Gary Carpenter teach this stuff online—I had read these scriptures myself over and over, but I guess it took the Lord, Himself to visit me and let me know in no uncertain terms what had to be done. Since then, I have had a new awareness of praying, especially for me or my loved ones.

Church, WE HAVE THE AUTHORITY AND WE HAVE TO USE IT IN ORDER TO GET OUR NEEDS MET, OUR PRAYERS ANSWERED, AND OUR MOUNTAINS MOVED!

I'm glad you asked—Look at Ephesians 1:3—"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who hath blessed us with all spiritual blessings in heavenly places <u>IN CHRIST</u> (emphasis mine)
