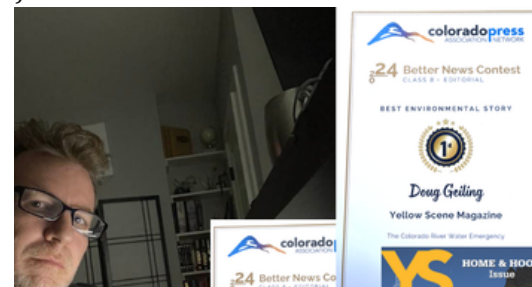
Thoughtfully Researched Conservation Journalism

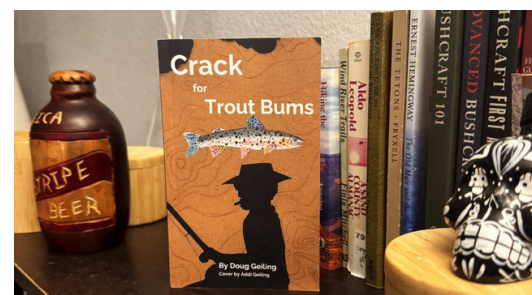
