



Director's Statement by Linnea Frye

Lily's Mirror was created after my world was turned upside-down following a life-altering emotionally abusive incident. As I shared what happened to me with my close female friends, they all had similar stories to share. Almost every woman I knew had experienced abusive treatment from within a personal and/or professional relationship, and yet it was never spoken about.

Psychological abuse is an invisible epidemic, and is often overlooked or dismissed, even though it can be equally as devastating as physical abuse. With Lily's Mirror, I wanted to give a visual representation to psychological abuse and violence against women while exploring women's journeys around recovery and a search for justice.

In order to keep the film approachable and encourage dialogue, the story was framed in a semi-fantastical way, using small comedic elements to allow for levity and relief. Set in 1990, color choices were inspired by early 90's tennis windbreakers and Claude Monet's Water Lilies. Dark and moody lighting was used to indicate Lily's despair, and further references of blue and yellow with bits of red were used to reference Snow White and her own mirror-based odyssey.

I was incredibly lucky to be joined by my long time friend and creative partner, Adam Pinney as my Co-Writer/Co-Director. Making this movie with him, along with my power-house Producer Megan Dahl, and a largely female cast and crew helped me take my power back and see myself through my own eyes again - and not through the distorted reflection of another's.
