Next Meeting: Thursday, Jan. 13, 2022, 6:00 pm at the Newland Christian Church located at 2800 Miller's Gap Hwy, Newland.

For the January meeting, Cindy Booth will have a presentation on making a chenille scarf. She will be demonstrating the technique and have some examples for members to see. We will concentrate on this project for our work-day this month as well, which is the Saturday following the meeting. We will provide fabric for those who would like to make a scarf, or please bring 3 - 1 yd. pieces of homespun or plaid fabrics in your choice of colors.

We will also be introducing a Block of the Month Project at January's meeting. Everyone is welcome to join the BOM at any time. The finished quilt will be a sampler with no set pattern or size. We plan to highlight different techniques throughout the year; some will be familiar while some may be new. The blocks will measure 12" square and should incorporate 3 different colors; one light, one medium and one dark. You will be using more than 3 *fabrics* throughout, but should keep to the 3 main *colors* for all blocks to insure the quilt is cohesive when finished. Several blocks will have a center square or be on point and would be appropriate for a fussy-cut print if desired. Cindy's example uses birds but other animals, floral or children's prints would also work great. Please be thinking on your color selection if you are interested in participating.
