Riverwalk Quilt Guild Minutes of the Meeting of February 10, 2022

BJ made a motion to approve the minutes as presented in the newsletter. Joyce seconded and they were approved.

Old Business:

Tiffany encouraged everyone to look at the GoDaddy website and to email or call her with feedback. She was putting the block of the month on the bars on the left upper side.

Linda passed around an address list for everyone to check and correct as needed.

Joyce volunteered to make a kit up for quilts for Crossnore Communities. Sheri had three in progress at the moment. Cindy had an easy quilt pattern which she would share for this purpose. It has large size and baby size instructions.

Noel indicated that she could make labels for the Crossnore children's quilts

Regarding our Raffle quilt, we have decided that the Winter Solstice pattern by Cory Quilts Designs will be the one which we will be making. It will be made with batiks. Cindy showed the blue and purple fabrics which she had attained from School House Quilts. Due to its charitable purpose School House Quilts had given a 20% discount on the purchase. Five members are planning to put it together. Hopefully, Linda as Treasurer will keep track of raffle sales and tickets. The tickets will sell for \$1.00 per ticket or 6 for \$5.00. Cindy said she had already sold 200 tickets. We hope to finish it as soon as possible given the goal of having a drawing in December 2022. Tiffany has asked for volunteers for various tasks. Sheri volunteered to do the long arm quilting for 50% off.

BJ presented the program on how to make a jelly roll / Hobo purse. She had sent out instructions in an E-mail. She had cut some strips to give to those who planned to make one. She will bring it on Saturday. She answered questions. A workshop is scheduled for Saturday February 19th. Bring a lunch.

Cindy announced that we have a lot of fabric which we acquired by giving a couple of donations. It will be stored in the closet as the church is allowing us to use this space. Members took some pieces of fabric home with them.

BJ put together some pretty fabrics from the new stash the Guild purchased, for making a purse like the one she had shown tonight. BJ also confirmed that there are many ways to chenille. She showed an apple tree panel which she had chenilled.



Cindy gave out the handout for the Block of the Month pattern for March. Several

members showed the Blocks they had made from the pattern for February.



Sandy had a quilt which Pat had made for a Children's charity. Tickets were \$2.00 per ticket, or 3 for \$5.00.

Show and Tell:

Cindy showed her easy pattern called Just Can't Cut It. Her quilt was in purple and green. She encouraged everyone to take a copy of the pattern if you think you will make one. Cindy also showed a mug rug.
