Minutes from the March Meeting

Riverwalk Quilt Guild Minutes of the Meeting of March 11, 2021

Tiffany called the meeting to order welcoming everyone. The minutes and the Treasurers report were not approved as they hadn't been received by members. This will be done next month.

Sheri Elderfield gave a wonderful program on string piece quilting. She had a handout showing how to do it and what effects could be achieved.

Old Business--

Leslie had retyped the Bylaws. All the members got a printed copy of the revision to reflect one-year term for officers. We will vote on them in April.

We have an exact count of 39 pillowcases for Jonas Ridge. We have enough however people have turned more in. We needed to pick a day for delivery and March 20th was the day. Leslie will call and let them know we are coming. This is exciting for the guild to be of service to the community in this manner. A thank you goes out to Tiffany for coordinating this effort.

Pene had called regarding the placemats for the Meals on Wheels recipients. We needed 85 and we have 22. Leslie had some more. It was suggested that next Saturday we could work on placemats. Suggested sizes are 13 X 19, 12 X 18, 14 X 20.

New Business--

Jo Marie announced that she had gone and purchased two gift certificates for Leslie. One to Fabrics in the Fray and the other to a local shop (possibly Brenda Kays.) Leslie said she had used them and enjoyed them. Thank you, Jo Marie, for your efforts.

An announcement was made that Terry at Bill's Sewing is retiring but would still be available for programs.

Foam and Fabrics in Marion is selling some of their fabric for \$6.50. Moda fabric may be included in this sell. The owner wants to move this fabric.

Gale's fabric shop in Marion, Stitch and Save Fabric Shop also has fabric marked down. Her business cards were passed out.

Members were also encouraged to visit Anita at Fabrics in the Fray and support our local shops.

We have a tote of fabrics available to be used for placemats. The workday is scheduled for March 20 from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm.

There were some free books and magazines for members to take.

Leslie went to the Senior Center and cleaned out the four storage lockers as they had asked us to vacate them. The History Books produced by Diana Trivette and the extension cords are currently as her house. Tiffany opened this issue on what to do with the storage locker contents for discussion pointing out that we have options. We could continue with the lending library though it has not been used that much possibly due to people using the Internet instead.

We could donate it. We could have a garage sale or try to sell them otherwise. It was brought up that some places are not taking magazines due to Covid. Jo Marie suggested giving any money raised to charity. It was suggested we sell them to us first then to the community. Etsy or Ebay was suggested but rejected due to having to maintain and manage the project.
