#### **25FALM1 -----Kendra MacDonald -----Grades K-2 -(Limit 8)**

**Lean in Girls Program**

- **Topics:** The curriculum covers key leadership topics through engaging, interactive activities and discussions, including:
  - **Building confidence and resilience:** Helping girls identify their values and embrace their unique strengths.
  - **Challenging stereotypes:** Teaching girls to recognize and push back against limiting stereotypes, including those that might appear positive.
  - **Reframing failure and risk-taking:** Encouraging girls to embrace imperfections and see mistakes as chances for growth.

**Diamond Art in the Bears Den**

Diamond art is a fun craft where kids place colorful, sparkly "diamonds" onto a sticky canvas to create a picture, much like a paint-by-numbers but with shiny gems instead of paint. A color-coded color chart tells you which diamond color goes on each symbol, and you use a special pen with wax to pick up the diamonds and stick them on the canvas to reveal a beautiful, glittering design.
