





PASTOR'S PEN



April is here already, can you believe it?? I feel like it has really snuck up on us. March was definitely "in like a lion" this year and now we are preparing for Spring and the excitement of Easter.

I have always thought that the season of Lent was an interesting one. We often think of this season as one of repentance, of sorrow, of sacrifice as we give up something for the season. But at the same time, outside the world is starting over again. It is waking from its winter time slumber. The grass is turning green, the flowers are emerging from the ground and blooming beautiful colors, gardeners and farmers are preparing the ground for their crops. To me, it has always felt like a weird dichotomy. Although maybe that is not true.

In the church the season of Lent is 40 days long; it is supposed to connect us to the stories of the Old and New Testament. It is to serve as a reminder of the days that Noah and his family watched the waters rise during the flood, the time that the Israelites wandered the desert, the time that Jesus spent in the wilderness before the beginning of his ministry. It also leads us to the end of his human life here on Earth. It is supposed to remind us that we are connected, that this is not a new story, that we are not alone in this wilderness that we have found ourselves in. In fact we are in good company.

These 40 days of Lent are supposed to serve as a time of preparation for what is to come. A time where we reset, where we wake up from our slumber. A time where we evaluate where we have been, what we have done, where we have fallen short and how we want to change that going forward.

These 40 days are supposed to serve as a time where we actually take the time, which might mean giving up something precious or that you hold too close, that is a distraction from your relationship with God. A time of evaluation, a time where we are supposed to be honest with ourselves, with our community and with God about what we have done and to focus on where we are going.

The Bible doesn't say a lot about what Jesus does in the wilderness; it says he fasted and he prayed but we don't know what exactly he prayed for but we can take some guesses. We can guess that he prayed for his ministry that was to come. That he prayed for his parents and friends that he left behind. We can guess that he prayed for strength and for God to be at his side through what was sure to be a not easy journey over the next couple of years.

We are halfway through Lent at the beginning of April this year and by the end of April we will be celebrating Easter. The question that I have been asking my Lenten study group throughout the study is what have you done to prepare yourself to follow Jesus to the cross? Although I sometimes think it feels weird to be in a time of repentance and sacrifice as we enter into Spring, it actually makes perfect sense. As the world is preparing to start anew. To wake up from the slumber of winter, we too are supposed to be preparing ourselves to awake our souls for what is to come next. This time of Lent is to remind us that God is not just calling Jesus from the wilderness to do great ministry but God is calling us also. Are you prepared? Have you taken the time, cultivated your soul so that you are ready for what God has planned? May you take this time to focus on what is important to make sure your soul is ready for the hope that will spring eternal as Jesus sacrifices himself on the cross for us this season.

SENDING HOPE AND EMPOWERMENT AROUND THE WORLD AND AROUND THE CORNER

Another Week, Another Two Shipments!

This week, we, once again, sent two shipments in one day!

Warehouse one was full of supplies ready to go to Maryland. Similarly, warehouse three and the loading dock were a maze of pallets, boxes, and loose items, waiting to be loaded for Honduras.

The Maryland shipment was first. Coordinated through our partner Food For The Poor, these supplies were specifically requested for an organization called Michael's Mission, based out of Metropolitan UMC in Maryland. The organization works to provide basic needs for school-age children, many of whom are homeless. Every year, we send two truck-loads of needed items their way.

This shipment included:

- 2,112 UMCOR Hygiene Kits
- 600 Blankets
- 27 Sets of pillows and sheets
- 560 UMCOR Menstrual Kits
- Cleaning Supplies
- 11 Sleeping Mats

The value was \$48,060.28. The second shipment was sent to Honduras; the value of this shipment was \$106,061.90.


