### PASTOR'S PEN



Happy May!

The end of the school year is upon us, as crazy as that might seem. When the kids were going to school in the fall, I would have not predicted that we would have gotten this far. I didn't foresee there being a vaccine, or that over 50% of the adult population in the United States would have received at least one half of that vaccine or that the kids would still be in-person school. Time is an interesting concept. Last year at this time, the days were going by so slowly. We were not meeting in person; we were not sure when we would be able to meet in person; we were not sure what was going to happen day to day. I suppose that last one is still true. Although we can make plans and set it all out in what we hope to have happen, we know that life continues to be unpredictable. Although most of the time we don't like to view it that way, as unpredictable,we like to have plans. We like to think that we know that the vacation we have planned in two months will happen, or that we will be able to see our loved ones next week or that we will indeed be having sirloin steak and fresh asparagus for dinner.

But then again we know that life is unpredictable. We know that our best laid plans can be canceled in an instant. We know that those that we believe will live forever, will in fact not. We know that time is not a tangible item but rather something that is flexible and moves unpredictably.

I have been thinking about Jesus' life and what it must have been like. I wonder how Jesus perceived time. Knowing that his days were numbered, did it change how he treated each day or was he like I am and forgot to treat every day like it is a true gift? They say when people receive the message that they are dying that it causes them to want to take advantage of their time left, but yet how often do we not take advantage of our time? How often do we put off calling our loved ones or spending time with our friends or reading to our children because we feel there is not enough time? As his life came to a close, I think Jesus felt that urgency. The Gospels say that he was trying to teach his disciples everything he could because he knew his time was near. I think that the disciples taught in the same way; they didn't know how much time they had. The church grew in those early days because there was an urgency; the days were going by quickly and the message was so important.

The message is no less important today than it was 2000 years ago. We should be proclaiming the Gospel message with the same urgency, the same excitement, with the same hope that the first disciples did. A message that was made for all people. A message that once it is heard Peter says in Acts chapter 10: "Surely no one can stand in the way of their being baptized with water. They have received the Holy Spirit just as we have."

Are we helping others receive the Holy Spirit with the time we have here? Are we doing it with urgency? Are we taking advantage of the time we have here because we know that even when it feels like it is passing slowly by, we know that in truth it will be gone before we know it and it is our job to be using it to the fullest. How are you taking advantage of the time we have here? Are you proclaiming the Gospel in the way you live and with those you interact with? God gifted us with this time, let us go forth and enjoy it.
