PASTOR'S PEN



I was talking to a friend today. She and I don't talk often, our relationship often consists of random memes, jokes and texts expressing our extreme care for each other. But she called me today for some reassurance. She was struggling with the guy that she is in a relationship with. It is complicated as most relationships that have much substance are. She was explaining about a quarrel they had gotten into in which a boundary was set, her significant other was not happy about this boundary, and a temper tantrum was thrown.

She called me, not because she was upset about how the conversation ended, although that certainly played a part but rather, she wanted assurance that God was present and at work in what was going on. She wanted to know that things were going to work out and that she would get through whatever it turned out to be. She has deep faith that her relationship with her partner will work out, they have been working on laying out a solid foundation and trying to learn from the mistakes of past relationships. But even when we feel solid about where you are going, there is often a need to know that you will get there.

She said she wakes up each morning, thanking God for waking her up, for her kids, and for her partner and she is ready to make this day a good one. Of course, not every day is a good one and when it isn't, sometimes we just need the assurance from someone else that it will be alright. That is what she needed today. The assurance that she was not alone, not the first person that has had to deal with this and that it will work itself out.

In the end what my friend really needed was a listening ear and a little encouragement that she was on the right path. This is the reason we have faith. We believe in an ever-present God that is always there for us through all things. We believe that when we need to be shown the path, or a little boost that God is there to provide it. We don't always see it but it so often comes from the presence of someone else. And sometimes it is from the lessons that we hear from others.

This month we are exploring four conversations that people had with or about Jesus. In this series called Overheard, we are going to explore the lessons we can learn from others that have been here before us. We are not alone; we are not the first to go through it and God will work it out. It might not be how we envisioned it, but it will be how God has, if we have the faith to rely on Him. This month may we remember the importance of reaching out when we need the extra assurance and as Proverbs says "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding;"
