## PASTOR'S PEN



#### Greetings!

We have made it through the end of the year. In some ways it is hard to believe that it is already December and yet in the same breath I say, "We made it!" For the church December often marks the beginning of a new year. Advent and the birth of Christ is the start of a new year for the church and for us. This week in one of my clergy groups, someone asked how to remember which order we celebrate the candles of Advent. Then someone responded "We hope for the love of God to fill our lives with joy and peace." This statement spoke so true to me especially this year. I think this year has shown us that it is exactly what we need to do. We are supposed to live in hope. A year where hope could easily be lost, we remember that our hope cannot be in humans but in the love of God. And when we have hope in the love of God, we will also find peace and joy.

Tis the season of Christmas letters and cards, where we see the pictures of what our friends and family have been up to this year. I assume like all other things this year, the letters will look different than they have in the past. Possibly not the great tales of the adventures of places my friends have traveled to this year but more likely a snapshot of sheltering in place and schooling from home. A year where we all remember how thankful we are for teachers for trying to teach our children math skills that we have long forgotten how to do. A year where we mourn the life that we had taken for granted where we could see our family and friends anytime we wanted to, or eat out at a restaurant or go to a concert or sporting event whenever we wanted to. A year where we realized that the simple things like hugging each other is something that even the biggest introvert misses. A year of unexpected events, things and happenings. Without a doubt the letters will be interesting this year.

And so, we enter Advent; we prepare for the birth of Christ. A season that is often filled with gatherings and celebrations but will without a doubt look different this year. This year where we aren't gathering in person for all of our celebrations, where we continue to physically distance ourselves from our families with the hope that we will get to gather again soon. All this while thinking about the very first Christmas. The day that a little baby was born with just his parents present. A baby that would change the world forever. A baby that came from humble means and was born so that all could feel the love of God and find peace and joy. Perhaps this year is affording us the opportunity to put ourselves in the shoes of Mary and Joseph, to think about what it would be like to be in a situation that would not be socially acceptable. To be a young teenager that is pregnant but not married. To be a man who finds out the woman he is to marry is pregnant and not with your child. To have to wrap your mind around the fact that the child you are going to raise is the Son of God. Perhaps this year where we are not able to run ourselves ragged with all the parties means we take a real moment to remember the reason for this season. That it is not a corporate holiday but rather the day we celebrate a baby being born. Mary and Joseph were in a space that was uncertain, a land that was not their home, doing what was commanded to them by the government. While all that was happening Luke chapter 2 says "6While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, <sup>7</sup> and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no quest room available for them."

Life changed forever. I pray that in this season you find hope in the love of God that will bring you peace and joy.
