



PASTOR'S PEN



Happy December! This year December marks the beginning of Advent. Advent for the church is the beginning of the new year. I have always thought it was interesting when we choose to start new things. Corporate America starts their fiscal years in September. New appointments for the church start in July. Our calendars start of course with January and for the church the year starts with Advent.

I suppose in some ways it makes sense that the church year starts with Advent. It is the time leading up to and preparing for the birth of Christ, who is a very important individual in the life of the church. ;-) It's four weeks of preparing, learning, listening, often with an invitation to slow down while also being the busiest time of the year. Advent is the beginning of the church year but the end of the calendar year. We have to cram in all the parties, all the doctors' appointments, all the school programs, church programs, baking of goods, cleaning the house for guests! In all the craziness of the end of year things, are we really working to prepare our hearts for the beginning of something new?

The birth of Christ is a big event now. But when it first happened...it was pretty simple, really kind of overlooked. The leaders of the day paid no attention to a pregnant teenage girl from humble beginnings. To a certain point I doubt the citizens of Nazareth paid much attention to a pregnant teenage girl. There was no hubbub, no craziness, no parties, or programs or anything really. In fact, this girl who is 9 months pregnant has to leave her home, walk/ride a donkey for many miles so that she can be counted in a census! Not because she is carrying God's child but because she is married to Joseph and his homeland was Bethlehem. She gives birth to this baby not in a palace, not surrounded by doctors or world leaders but with her husband at her side, no pomp and circumstance. The Bible says the angels did praise the birth of Jesus but there was really nobody else around.

A quiet Christmas? What would that look like today? In some ways we may have gotten a taste of that in 2020, although it wasn't as crazy, by then some of the craziness of life had returned. What would it look like if we took time to contemplate what is really happening in the story of Jesus' birth? What would it be like to really experience the silence of the Silent Night?

This Advent we are doing a sermon series called Comfort and Joy. We are looking at the joy that the birth of Jesus brought but also what does it look like to receive his comfort? Isaiah 40:1 says "Comfort, comfort my people! says your God" Are we bringing comfort? In the preparation we are doing for the coming of the Lord are we bringing comfort? What does that look like? I pray as we explore that this month, you will take some time out of your holiday season to think about comfort, the comfort the birth of Jesus brings us but also the comfort we can share with each other. Merry Christmas!


ONGOING MISSION PROJECT – COLLECTING PLASTIC FILM FOR PARK BENCHES

- Stay in your car and listen to a podcast while viewing the animals.


