## PASTOR'S PEN



February is often thought of as the month of love. Valentine's Day is right in the middle of the month and so the whole month is surrounded by the need to find a person to show a massive outward sign of your love.

When I was in grade school of course the excitement of Valentine's Day was really just around getting candy, as it so often is as kids. As I got older and shed the excitement of classroom parties and getting little premade paper cards, I had decided that there was really no point to Valentine's Day. Looking back, my hate and angst against the day had much to do with my lack of a boyfriend. -)

Even now though I think of Valentine's Day as a little silly. I fall into the "if you really love someone, why are you waiting for a specific day to share the love" camp; but at the same time you sometimes need special occasions to remind the person that you love them or show them in a new way.

Love is an interesting word, and one that fails us as English speakers. There are so many types of love. There is the love I feel for chocolate;, there is the love I feel for my friends; there is the love I feel for my kids, my family, my husband, my community, for God. They are all different kinds of love and yet we only get one word that is supposed to encompass it all. The Greek language has 7 different words for love. They knew that one word was not enough because there are so many varieties of love. Yet so often, especially in February the focus is on just one type of love, the romantic type.

The Bible talks about love more than any other thing. But it is not just one type of love. There is reference to what it means to love God, to love your neighbor, to love your family, to love your community and your friends. When Jesus says love your neighbor, he is not talking about a romantic love...most likely anyway. He is talking about a love that is caring, watchful and kind. What if instead of buying the giant bouquet of flowers for one person, we focused on loving our neighbors, on loving ourselves? Maybe this is a time where the schools have it right. When the kids take Valentine's to school, they take one for each child in their classrooms. Not necessarily because they all are the best of friends, it is an inclusion thing but what if we take the time to talk to our kids about how we can use this opportunity to show love to our neighbor? And if you don't have kids, how can you show love to those around you? What if we loved our neighbor this month, as a way to celebrate Valentine's Day?

This month we continue to talk about the ways Jesus showed those around him who he was, what epiphanies were present and how we continue to see them today. Matthew 5:8 says ""Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God." May you be pure of heart this month. Remembering to love your neighbor as God has loved you.
