## PASTOR'S PEN



Of all the summer months, July may be my favorite. If you have been around me for long, you know that summer is not my favorite. The heat is terrible, there are mosquitos, and the kids are restless without the routine of school. However, July also has the 4th celebration; for my family it has always been a time of reunions. My favorite part is the beginning of having a garden full of produce! There is something so special about that first tomato from the garden, the first cucumber picked from the vine or the first batch of zucchini patties cooked up at dinner. Oh and who can forget sweet corn! Man, this is the best time of year!

I want to say that gardening is a simple activity but anyone that has ever really had a garden knows that is not true. It takes planning to have a garden, preparation of the ground, buying the seeds, planting the seeds, watering the garden, and then waiting for it to grow and produce something. And if it was really just about waiting for the plants to grow that might be simple but it is not just the seeds that you plant that grow. If you plant the seeds and then return to your garden in July hoping that you will have tomatoes, peppers and cucumbers, you might be surprised as to what you find. You will probably find a garden in disarray. A space that was once smooth and clear ground, where you so carefully planned and planted those seeds will be now full of unruly and crazy weeds. You might find that the weeds are actually even bigger than your plants; they have grown with great gusto, loving this ground that you so nicely prepared in hopes of getting great produce. In fact, in my experience the weeds grow faster than the seeds and plants that I plant; it is a real wonder of the world how that happens. To really get what you desire out of a garden, you have to tend to it. Beyond planting and an occasional drink of water, you also have to weed it, guide your plants where you want them to grow and watch over it. It is interesting that our faith is so similar to planting and growing a garden.

When we learn about who God is, it is like preparing a garden. We pick the perfect spot of land, we prepare the ground and when we accept Christ into our lives, it is planting a seed into our hearts and souls. Sometimes we think that is all that is needed. We have planted the seeds; they will be fine on their own. It will grow and produce fruit and life will be grand. Except that just as with gardening, our journey with Christ is not easy either. We have to continue to tend to the garden of our soul. We have to water it with the worship and studying of the Word. We have to guide it with our actions. But if we don't, if we just let those seeds sit and hope that they will do what they are supposed to, we will come back and find a soul full of weeds. If we simply just go to church on Sundays but don't live out the message, our souls will be overtaken. Because just like the weeds in my garden, the wickedness of the world seems to grow faster than the goodness of our souls.

The interesting thing about weeds though, if you get them when they are still small and stay on top of weeding your garden, as the seeds you sowed get bigger, you will find that the weeds aren't as prevalent. Sure, you still have to tend to it; but it is not such a huge undertaking as it might have seemed. Our souls are the same. If we tend to our souls, we will find that the goodness will overtake the evil. We will find that it doesn't seem like such an undertaking. We will find that the weeds of evil aren't as big as we thought. We will find that the outcome, the taste of our fruitfulness tastes all the sweeter. Psalm 128 says "Blessed are all who fear the LORD, who walk in his ways. You will eat the fruit of your labor; blessings and prosperity will be yours." May you tend to and enjoy the fruits of your soul this month.
