
UWIF CORNER


Murdock UWIF will have their next meeting on Wednesday, March 1, 2023 at 5:30 p.m. for their usual meal and meeting at the church.

Happy March,

Here we are at the beginning of another month but also the beginning of Lent. Lent has always been an interesting time for me. As I was growing up, it was all about giving something up. Depriving myself of something that I love for the next month and a half. The problem was that I was never really sure why I had to give something up. Why am I giving up a thing I love, what is it going to achieve in the grand scheme of things other than break a habit I have like drinking soda or chewing gum? I have thought many times over the years about this concept of giving up something for Lent.

I don't know about you all but I often find myself doing things that are really surface level without fully digging into the why of it. Why do we eat fish on Fridays? Why are Sundays and Wednesday church days? Why do we give up something during Lent? Sometimes we do these things without thinking about the why because we don't have the time to really dig in, that is fine. But when we talk about Lent and giving up something should the why not be something we dig into?

The theory behind giving up something for Lent is that giving up something is causing a distraction for us as Christians from our relationship from God. What are the things that are stopping you from fully investing in your relationship with God? Maybe you are valuing sleep over morning prayer or catching up on the newest episode of your favorite show over reading the Bible. Perhaps you are drinking alcohol instead of following the way God is leading you. Those are the things you are supposed to be giving up. Making a change that will bring you closer to God.

I know when I was a kid and at times even now, the concept of giving up something for Lent is almost like a fad. It is the cool thing to do. But are we doing it for the right reason? If we are really going to deprive ourselves of something that we like or love, should there not be a goal of gaining something of substance in return? The goal of this time of Lent is to bring us closer to God. If that means we need to give up something that is distracting you from that relationship, make sure it means you are taking the next step which is building that stronger relationship with God. Just giving something up isn't getting us any closer to our goal.

Jesus fasted in the desert for 40 days and 40 nights as a way to force himself to rely more fully on God and his relationship with Him. After being tempted by Satan three times, Jesus' final reply is this "Away with you, Satan! for it is written, 'Worship the Lord your God, and serve only him.'" Satan knows when we are growing closer with God; and like with Jesus, Satan will tempt us. As we strive to strengthen our relationship with God this season, may we remember to also push Satan away and worship and serve God only.
