

Happy March!

March marks many things, the beginning of Spring, March Madness and this year Easter! Although the winter thus far has been pretty mild...fingers crossed for more snow! ;-)...and I have already had the itch to plant my garden. March is really the time when we get serious about planning where everything is going to go. March is still early and most plants won't go in the ground until mid-April but the time is coming and it is good to have a plan. At least that is what Nick tells me. But March is unpredictable as to what is going to come up. That is why they call the basketball playoffs March Madness right? Anything could happen, in fact oftentimes the unpredictable does happen. March as a month is just like that right? The old saying is "In like a lion, out like a lamb." Just proving that even March doesn't know what March is supposed to do. Should it be fierce or should it be calm, cool and collected.

But March is great; it is the time when new leaves appear on trees, spring flowers begin to spring up and we are reminded that the cold, dead looking Earth is not really dead. 
READING HELPS THE MIND AND HEART GROW!

The crosses will be "planted" in the corn field south of the Buell's home.









The crosses can be home-made or purchased, decorated or plain. Names and stories connected to the cross are optional.


