A WORD FROM THE BOARD CHAIR & PRESIDENT/CEO

The 2023-2024 year has been nothing short of extraordinary for Communities In Schools of Delaware (CISDE)!

We kicked off the year with prestigious national recognition: Our very own board member, **Dr. Jeffrey D.**Menzer, Superintendent of Colonial School District, was honored as CIS National's Education Partner of the Year. His unwavering advocacy has brought CIS programming to 12 of the 14 schools in his district, making a lasting impact on students' lives.

A Historic Visit from CIS National Leadership

For the first time in our 33-year history, CISDE had the honor of welcoming one of our founding leaders, Bill Milliken, CIS National Board Vice Chairman, along with CIS National President & CEO Rey Saldaña. Their visit was a powerful moment for our organization, engaging directly with our site coordinators, school administrators, and most importantly, the students we serve. They were joined by Reed Hartley, CIS National's Vice President for Advancement, for an inspiring two-day experience.

One of the most exciting features of their visit was observing The Iceberg Activity, performed by a **girls' empowerment group** focusing on self-esteem and trauma resilience, led by our **Site Coordinator, Ericka Fulton-Moncrief**, at Early College School of Delaware State University.

Connecting Students to Bright Futures

In March 2024, we partnered with JP Morgan Chase's Professionals Helping Adolescents Succeed in Education (P.H.A.S.E.) mentors to host a dynamic Networking Reception at William Penn High School—our pioneering CISDE site. This event highlighted the incredible work of our CISDE team on prospective new schools, while students shared firsthand how CISDE has shaped their success. The event also featured special remarks from our National CIS officials and New Castle County Executive, Matt Meyer.

Expanding Our Reach & Impact

A major milestone this year was CISDE's selection for the CIS National Scaling for Success initiative (Cohort 2), in partnership with The Balmer Group. This national philanthropic leader has committed millions to scaling CIS programs, and with their support, we are securing matching funding for four new CISDE sites from 2024 to 2027—bringing life-changing support to even more students.

The Data Speaks of Student Success & Continued Growth

Our data confirms that at least 80% of our students are meeting or making progress toward their goals across key areas, although, like many districts nationwide, attendance remains a challenge.


