As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. (Colossians 3:12)

One of my favorite comics was "Calvin and Hobbes." In one strip, Calvin approaches a ringing phone. Then, holding the phone to his ear, he says, "Hello? . . . No, my dad's not here right now. Will I take

a message? I don't know – what's in it for me?" Having hung up the phone, he walks away saying, "People always assume you're some kind of altruist."

I don't know about that. But I do agree with Rabbi Harold Kushner, who believed that we are all created to be altruists – and for our own good. In an anthology entitled Handbook for the Soul, he wrote: "I believe that each of us was put on this earth to fulfill his or her potential for humanity, and the soul Is that part of us that makes us truly human. When we fulfill our soul's destiny, we feel 'right.' Conversely, when we ignore our soul's destiny, when we get caught up in our own self-interests and forget to care for others, we feel empty and unfulfilled. When I talk to people who feel this emptiness and lack of fulfillment . . . I suggest they find some way to 'give back' something to the world in order to feel a sense of completeness. Too often people make the mistake of believing that if they only had more money or more sex or a different partner or a better-looking body, they would feel the sense of 'wholeness' they have always craved. Virtually without exception, this is not the case. What is actually lacking is the dimension of giving and kindness as a means of nourishing the soul."

The qualities expressed in Colossians (especially kindness), seem to be in short supply these days, when "What's in it for me?" appears to be the prevailing ethos. So, for the sake of our world and for the sake of our souls – which are in need of kindness – let us all, as James M. Barrie, creator of Peter Pan, once suggested, "Always be a little kinder than necessary."

To that end, here are 10 easy ways to be kind.

- 1. Give five compliments every day.
- 2. Let a person with only a few items go ahead of you in the grocery line.
- 3. Give a loved one an extra hug.
- 4. Smile at everyone you see.
- 5. Be a buddy to a new coworker.
- 6. Pick up trash where you're walking.
- 7. Offer to return a grocery cart for an elderly or disabled person or a mother with small children.
- 8. Write a thank you to someone who influenced you.
- 9. When someone tries to merge in your traffic lane, let them in, and wave as you do.
- 10. Leave a treat or note of thanks for a person who provides a service.

May your acts of kindness feed your soul and make this world a better place! Pastor Eileen




