One of the most impressive aspects of the Gospel is its simplicity. It's difficult for the world to understand this, so frequently, in an effort to be impressive, people complicate things.

It took Jesus only about 170 words to answer the question, "Who is my neighbor?" It takes only 9 minutes to read the Sermon on the Mount. The Lord's

Prayer contains only 56 words. The Gettysburg Address contains only 268 words and the Declaration of Independence 1,322 words. But according to a study by Business Roundtable (an association of chief executive officers of America's leading companies) "a government regulation on the sale of cabbage required 26,911 words."

Furthermore, Jesus used words that would fill any language: light, love, life, truth, peace, bread, water, God, home, parents, children. He drew his lessons from such ordinary and common things as the birds of the air and the lilies of the field. He also used words that translate into one or two syllable words, such as ask, search, knock, come, take, believe, follow. They strike at what Reinhold Niebuhr called the vulnerable center of society. No matter how complicated society becomes, it cannot escape the simple things of life.

Many wise and intelligent people have been quoted on simplicity. Artist Hans Hoffmann: "The ability to simplify means to eliminate the unnecessary so the necessary may speak." Economist E. F. Schumacher: "Any third-rate engineer or researcher can increase complexity; but it takes a certain flair of real insight to make things simple again." Bassist Charles Mingus: "Making the simple complicated is commonplace; making the complicated simple – that's creativity." Leonardo da Vinci: "Simplicity is the ultimate sophistication."

My favorite take on simplicity is the best-known song of the Shakers, "A Gift to Be Simple." 'Tis the gift to be simple, 'tis the gift to be free, 'tis the gift to come down where we ought to be. And when we are in the place just right, 'twill be in the valley of love and delight. When true simplicity is gained, to bow and to bend we shall not be ashamed; to turn, turn will be our delight, till by turning, turning, we come round right.

As we seek to follow Jesus in our faith understanding and our daily living, let's keep it simple!


