### Black History Highlight: Dr. Martin L. King

January 21st is an important day for Americans to celebrate. For it is the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. celebration as a national holiday. This day is always the 3rd Monday in January.

Dr. King was a Baptist minister and a civil rights activist. With other Black ministers, he established the Southern Christian Leadership Conference in 1957 to expand the nonviolent struggle against racism and discrimination. As a civil rights leader, he played a pivotal role in ending the legal segregation of African-American citizens and in the passing of the Civil Rights Act of 1964. He received the Noble Peace Prize in 1964 and was instrumental in the Voting Rights Act of 1965. He led many marches and demonstrations for equal rights and justice for all.

One of the noteworthy marches was held on August 28, 1963 in Washington, DC to call attention to Black unemployment in America. Over 200,000 people were present. The high point of this march was his famous "I Have A Dream" speech which he eloquently defined the moral basic of the Civil Rights Movement.
