Sunday, May 15

Hebrews 12:1-14 *Pursue peace with all men and the sanctification without which no one will see the Lord.* (v.14 NAS)

My church's motto is "Preach the gospel, love people, and trust God." The writer of the Epistle to the Hebrews tells us to lay aside the sin that so easily entangles us and to run with endurance the race that is set before us (v.1). It seems that our church motto is a good plan for doing just that!

We need to pursue peace with everyone. In our divided world where so many voices spew out hate and division, we need to daily proclaim the gospel, love people, and trust God. Then we will experience the sanctification that help us see God.

Leviticus 8:1-13, 30-36; Psalms 24, 29; Luke 4:16-30

Monday, May 16

Psalm 56 When I am afraid, I will put my trust in Thee, in God whose word I praise. In God I have put my trust, I shall not be afraid. (vv.3-4a)

As we look at the future we are often filled with fear about our health, our jobs, our finances, and our relationships. The psalmist helps us remember that we can trust in God.

I like to use Psalm 91 as a reminder that I can trust in Him, starting with verse 14. God is speaking: "Because (your name) has loved Me therefore I will deliver (her/him). I will set (her/him) on high because (she/he) has known My name. (She/he) will call upon Me and I will deliver (her/him). With long life will I satisfy (her/him) and grant (her/him) My salvation."

Thanks so much, God, that I can trust in You.

Matthew 6:7-15 "For if you forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father will forgive you." (v.14)

Jesus has just taught the disciples the Lord's Prayer after they ask him to "teach us how to pray." Often people will say, "I'll forgive but I won't forget" Jesus says if we don't forgive (and forget) our heavenly Father won't forgive us. It is only with the help of the Holy Spirit that we can forgive. It is a gift we can bestow on others. We are to cast all our cares on God because He cares for us. Vengeance is the Lord's work, not ours.

Remember, we promise in the Lord's Prayer to forgive as we have been forgiven. Our Father, forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us.
