

The Bishop says

My sisters and brothers in Christ, we have gathered here as the family of God to offer our worship and praise, and to pray for God's blessings on all who work in his name. Today we thank God for the ministry and mission of the Church over the years in this parish and for those who have shared in it, and now, as we institute Sanford to this new ministry as the Rector, so we rededicate ourselves to the call of God, to the growth of the Kingdom, and to the building up of the Body of Christ, the Church.

The Bishop, clergy, and people sit, and the Rector-Elect is presented.

The Institution

The Wardens, standing before the Bishop with the new priest, say

Bishop Eaton, we have come together today to welcome the Reverend Dr. Sanford Groff, Jr., who has been chosen to serve as Rector of Good Shepherd Episcopal Church and School. We believe that he is well qualified, and that he has been prayerfully and lawfully selected.

- *Bishop:* Sanford, my brother, the Episcopal Church is part of the One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church, worshipping the one true God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It professes the faith uniquely revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds, and it is this faith the Church is called upon to proclaim afresh in each generation. Led by the Holy Spirit, it has borne witness to Christian truth in its historic formularies, The Book of Common Prayer and the Ordering of Bishops, Priests, and Deacons. In the declaration you are about to make, will you affirm your loyalty to this inheritance of faith as your inspiration and guidance under God in bringing the grace and truth of Christ to this generation and making him known to those in your Care?
- *Rector-Elect:* I, Sanford, do so affirm, and accordingly declare my belief in the faith which is revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the Catholic creeds and to which the historic formularies of The Episcopal Church bear witness; and in public prayer and administration of the sacraments, I will use only the forms of service that are authorized or allowed by Canon.

The Rector-Elect signs the Declaration in the sight of the People.

Bishop: Let the Letter of Institution be read.

The Archdeacon reads the Letter of Institution.

Bishop: Sanford, do you, in the presence of this congregation, commit yourself to this new trust and responsibility?

Rector-Elect: I do, firm in my trust in God's grace.

All stand.

The Bishop then addresses the congregation.

Bishop: My sisters and brothers of Good Shepherd Episcopal Church and School, by baptism you have been grafted into the community of faith, God's holy fellowship, the body of Christ, the Church. Together with your new priest you have been called to share in the Church's mission to preach the Gospel and to restore all people to unity with God and each other in Christ. In baptism you are fully empowered and authorized to exercise ministry in Christ's name, with mutual affection and respect in this parish, in our Episcopal Church in Southeast Florida, and in the wider Church and community.

Remember that the whole community of faith has the necessary gifts of grace for ministry. In prayer, join with your priest in discerning the vision for this parish, and in calling forth the leadership, resources, and talents that this vision requires. As you love and serve God's people, remember always to love, support, nourish, and pray for your priest, his family, and the members of the staff and others who serve with you and with him here.

My sisters and brothers, do you, in the presence of your new priest and the gathered Church, commit yourself to this trust and responsibility?

People: We do, firm in our trust in God's grace.

The Bishop then says

Let us now offer our prayers to God for all God's people, for this congregation, and for Sanford, your new Rector.

THE HOLY GOSPEL

In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you." But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I am a virgin?" THE SERMON The Very Rev. Dr. Anthony Holder

After a brief period of silence, representatives of the congregation and of the clergy of the diocese come forward and stand before the Bishop with the Rector-Elect. The congregation remains seated.

LUKE 1:26-38

THE INDUCTION

The Bishop says

My sisters and brothers in Christ, we now present the symbols of ministry that represent the fullness of our common life in the Body of Christ.

Representatives from Good Shepherd School present a Bible, saying Sanford, accept this Bible, and be among us as one who proclaims the Word. *People:* **Amen**.

The Bishop presents a vessel of water, saying Sanford, take this water, and help me baptize in obedience to our Lord. *People:* **Amen.**

Representatives from our Youth and Children present a stole, saying Sanford, receive this stole, and be among us as a pastor and priest. *People:* **Amen.**

Representatives of our Search Committee present a Book of Prayers, saying Sanford, receive this book, and be among us as a man of prayer. *People:* **Amen.**

Representatives of our Healing Team and Outreach Committee present Holy Oil, saying Sanford, use this oil, and be among us as a healer and reconciler. *People:* **Amen.**

The Wardens present the keys of the building, which signify the authority of the Rector, saying Sanford, receive these keys, and let the doors of this place be open to all people. *People:* **Amen.**

The Canon to the Ordinary and the Dean of the Deanery present the Constitution and Canons of this Church, saying Sanford, obey these Canons, and be among us to share in the councils of this diocese. *People:* **Amen.**

Representatives of our Altar Guild present Bread and Wine, saying Sanford, take this bread and wine, and be among us to break the Bread and bless the Cup. *People:* **Amen.**

The Bishop then says Sanford, let all these be signs of the ministry which is mine and yours in this place. *People:* **Amen.**

Kneeling, the Rector-Elect says

Lord my God, I am not worthy to have you come under my roof; yet you have called your servant to stand in your house, and to serve at your altar. To you and to your service I devote myself, body, soul, and spirit. Fill my memory with the record of your mighty works; enlighten my understanding with the light of your Holy Spirit; and may all the desires of my heart and will center in what you would have me do. Make me an instrument of your salvation for the people entrusted to my care, and grant that I may faithfully administer your holy Sacraments, and by my life and teaching set forth your true and living Word. Be always with me in carrying out the duties of my ministry. In prayer, quicken my devotion; in praises, heighten my love and gratitude; in preaching, give me readiness of thought and expression; and grant that, by the clearness and brightness of your holy Word, all the world may be drawn into your blessed kingdom. All this I ask for the sake of your Son our Savior Jesus Christ. **Amen**.

Bishop: Archdeacon Bazin, I now ask you to induct the new Rector into his ministry by seating him in the customary stall of the Rector in the sanctuary.

The Archdeacon escorts the new Rector to his place in the sanctuary, and places him in the seat he will occupy during worship.

Archdeacon: Sanford, my brother, by the authority of the Bishop, and with the consent of the people, I place you in the accustomed seat of the priest of this parish. May God watch over your going out and your coming in, from this day forth and for evermore. **Amen**.

The Archdeacon and the new Rector return to the Bishop in front of the congregation.

The Bishop presents their new Rector and his family to the congregation, saying

Greet your new Rector, and his husband, Tony.

It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. Through the great shepherd of your flock, Jesus Christ our Lord; because you gave Jesus Christ, your only Son, to be born for us; who, by the mighty power of the Holy Spirit, was made perfect Man of the flesh of the Virgin Mary his mother; so that we might be delivered from the bondage of sin, and receive power to become your children. Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who forever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest. Hosanna in the highest.

The People remain standing or kneel. The Bishop continues

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all. He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Bishop and People:

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

The Bishop continues

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with the Blessed Virgin Mary and all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and forever. **Amen**.

Bishop And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say:

All join in saying the Lord's Prayer

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. THE INVITATION TO HOLY COMMUNION

You are invited to receive Holy Communion this afternoon, an ancient practice intended for all baptized Christians, no matter your tradition.

You may receive just the Bread (which is full participation in the sacrament), or both the Bread and the Wine. As an alternative to sipping directly from the cup, you may receive by intinction and the priest will dip the Bread in a separate chalice for you. To receive by intinction please fold your hands in front of you at the altar rail to indicate your preference. Gluten-free wafers are available; please make your need known to the minister.

For those not receiving Holy Communion, you may also cross your arms over your chest for a blessing.
