Week Five... Finding Peace Within and Being Peace

If possible, so far as it depends upon you, live peaceably with all. —Romans 12:18



During the Lenten season, Paul urged peaceful conduct with all people, and benevolence. This exhortation can help us better use these 40 days when God calls us to meet Him in our desert place.

Lent is a time for spiritual discernment. It is by sincere discernment we can find peace, and live peacefully with ourselves and others. It is impossible to carry out a fruitful spiritual discernment if we do not regularly dedicate time to solitude and inner peace. Moments in which we abandon our social profiles and agendas, times where we no longer define ourselves by our profession, our commitments, our curriculum - moments in which we face the nakedness of just being. This is what we are called to do during Lent; enter into a solitude that will allow us to find

ourselves, to rediscover ourselves, to find peace. Even in this journey of spiritual discernment, we are not alone, but always under the gaze of the divine presence of God. God shows us our true identity.

It is impossible to listen to the murmurs of the Spirit within us if we do not regularly immerse ourselves in silence. Every day we must break with the noise of our lives, close the door for a moment to the frantic din of our "modernity"; close the email, cut off the Wi-Fi and let God speak to our hearts. God speaks when we are silent before Him. Be silent and adopt a peaceful attitude in all situations; put the strength of your soul to the task of being still and listening.

This is my prayer and wish for you this Lenten season.
